## Reason for decision:

This report refers to a previous Portfolio Holder decision which sought approval for the Council to enter into a licence agreement for storage facilities for the Museum Reserve Collection.

It serves to approve an additional amount of £1,200, which will meet the revised costs of the new storage facility, Unit 15, taking the total rental cost to £13,200 per annum.

## Options considered and rejected:

None.

## **Background Report:**

This report refers to a previous report seeking authority for the Council to enter into a Licence for Unit 15, at Oakwood Hill Industrial Estate, for storage of the Museum Reserve Collection.

- 1) Following the transfer of approximately 50% of the Reserve Collection that was held in two large storage buildings at Oakwood Hill Industrial Estate, to the Museum site in Waltham Abbey in 2015/16, a new and smaller storage facility was negotiated with Grangewood and the remaining items moved into this store in early 2016.
- 2) It was hoped to secure permanent storage facilities for these items, at the Waltham Abbey Police Station site, but unfortunately the Council was unsuccessful in its bid to the Police and Crime Commissioner. Therefore, in order to reduce the level of cost for the resulting storage required, the museum negotiated a smaller and cheaper unit at Oakwood Hill and the reserve collection was transferred to this site in April 2017.
- 3) A previous Portfolio Holder report received approval for the authority to enter a Licence for the new storage and at the time, the cost of the Unit, was thought to be £12,000 per annum. However, the actual cost of this unit was in fact £13,200 per annum.
- 4) This report therefore seeks Portfolio Holder authority to increase the approval to a revised amount of £13,200, from within existing provision.
