

I am employed by Essex County Council's Trading Standards Service. I am authorised for the purposes of the Licensing Act 2003. On the 29th September 2007 I was accompanied by colleagues Julie Peckston, Jemmy Tremlett and Dean Velati to the home of a 16 year old school boy, who was assisting Trading Standards in making test purchases of alcohol from selected retailers. I witnessed Jenny Tremlett inform as to the structure of the day and read to him a document entitled 'Notes for the volunteer - alcohol'. These notes outline to the test purchaser the procedures for the operation and for their care and welfare. I witnessed Jenny Tremlett measure height at 1.66ms, this measurement was made whilst wearing shoes. I was present when Jenny Tremlett took two Polaroid photographs of clothing that he was to be wearing during the attempted test purchases. Jenny Tremlett also confirmed with that he was neither carrying

any money or alcohol on him. At approximately 12:18 on the 29th September 2007. I accompanied Julie Peckston, Jenny Tremlett and Dean Velati, Police Constable 250 Harrington to the area of Odzil Foods, 1 Farm Hill Road, Waltham Abbey, EN9 1NN. I witnessed Jenny Tremlett confirm with that he was happy to continue with the visits. given money to cover the potential purchase. I entered the premises of Odzil Foods, 1 Farm Hill Road, Waltham Abbey. A short while later I witnessed enter the premise and go to the alcohol display area. I witnessed select 1 x bottle of Becks, 66cl, 5% volume. walked to the till. I followed him and formed a queue directly behind him at the till. I witnessed place the 1 x bottle of Becks, 66cl, 5% volume on the till. I had a clear and unobstructed view of the sale and at no asked his age or for any form of identification. The sale was made at 12.23. I then purchased some confectionery and followed out of the premise. I walked back to the vehicle where I was assisted by Jenny Tremlett in filling out the documentation including my notebook. I completed the details of the purchase in a sample book with sample number 00548. I produce the sample book entry identified as SM/1. The 1 x bottle of Becks with an alcohol content of 5% was placed in an inverted plastic evidence bag and sealed with security tag number A153236. At approximately 12.36 I returned to Odzil Foods, 1 Farm Hill Road, Waltham Abbey accompanied by Police Constable 250 Harrington. I introduced myself, and Police Constable 250 Harrington to the seller who I now know to be Mr Ozan Koroglu, once I introduced myself and the Police Constable, Mr Koroglu told me that he didn't speak very good English, which lead him to

ring Mr Odzil who is the DPS, and the premise licence holder of the store, I was passed the phone by Mr Koroglu, and explained to Mr Odzil what had happened, he then said he would be there in 5 minutes. Once Mr Odzil arrived I explained that a sale had taken place with our 16 year old volunteer, he then explained to Mr Koroglu what had happened and then Mr Koroglu was issued with a fixed penalty notice, we discussed the sale that had been made and I advised that I would be in contact in due course. Shortly after we left the premises. On returning to the office I placed the 1 x bottle of Becks, 66cl, 4% volume into the Services Secure store at Beaufort Road,

On 19th January 2008 I was accompanied by my colleagues Gareth Miller and Keith Pike and pour 16 year old volunteer to Epping Police Station. We were informed by the officer on duty that PC Lamb, who had been expected to join us, was unavailable due to work commitments. was assisting Trading Standards that day in making test purchases of alcohol from selected retailers. I took 2 photographs of he would be wearing that day. These are labelled as JP/02 and JP/03. I was assisted by Gareth Miller in measuring the height of the at 1.83m. I then a document entitled 'Notes for the Volunteer' labelled as JP/01. These notes outline to the volunteer the procedures for the test purchasing operation and for their care and welfare. At approximately 12.13 I entered the premises of Ozdil Foods, Farmhill Road, Waltham Abbey, EN9 1NE. I was followed by Nathan at 12.14. I picked up some biscuits and watched Nathan enter the shop and go to the alcohol section. He picked up 4 bottles of Fosters Twist Premium Lager 330ml 4.5% abv. He asked the seller how much they were and the seller answered £1 each, so £4. the counter where the male seller stood alone. He gave the seller the money.

I moved to stand directly behind at the counter and witnessed the sale take place at 12.15. The male seller behind the counter, who I now know to be Ozan Karoglu at no time made no attempt to ask for ID or question his age. Ieft the shop at 12.16. I paid for my goods and left the shop at 12.17. I had a clear and unobstructed view of the sale and at no time was asked for any form of identification. I walked back to the vehicle where I was assisted by Gareth Miller in filling out the documentation including my notebook. I completed the details of the purchase in a sample book with sample number 00674. I produce the sample book entry identified as JP/041. The alcohol was placed in an inverted plastic evidence bag and sealed with security tag number A154005. I produce this as JP/05. On returning to the office I placed the sample into the Services Secure store at 2 Beaufort Road, Dukes Park Industrial Estate, Chelmsford.

Dear Sir.

I has come to my notice from various sources of the Public, Police Community Service Officers and Police Officers that persons under the age of 18 years are obtaining alcohol from your shop. In fact 14year old girl seen leaving your shop with bagged alcohol on Saturday evening and this resulted in two C.I.D. officers calling at the shop and formally warning you that this must stop.

The penalties for selling alcohol to persons under age are very severe which could conclude with a review hearing with the loss of the premises licence. The offence also caries serious fines and the possibility of imprisonment.

As a safeguard against this practice County Council Trading Standards Officers from time to time at random with test purchase premises where there is a reported problems and prosecution will follow.

I am willing to discuss the matter you so please call me on the above number. The practice of sales to young persons will stop and you must age for photographic identification if the age is in doubt.

I have reviewed a file presented by one of the officers of this department concerning the sale of alcohol to a young person under the age of eighteen years. The sale took place from the premises of Odzil Foods, 1 Farmhill Road, Waltham Abbey, Essex, EN9 1NN on 29 September 2007.

You will be fully aware that it is an offence to sell alcohol to persons under the age of eighteen. It is your responsibility as the premise licence holder to ensure that no such sale takes place from these premises. I understand that a licensee of this particular premises has been previously advised of the licensees obligations relating to such matters.

In the light of the circumstances surrounding this incident it is not proposed to proceed further with this matter but I would advise you that this formal letter of warning will be retained on file as evidence that you have been warned by this Service. It will be brought forward should any further contravention be found and a decision taken to institute legal proceedings. It is the intention that a further inspection of your premises is carried out in the near future. A copy of this letter will be sent to the Police Licensing Section at Epping Forest Police Station.

4. TEST PURCHASING

Epping Forest figures, at 36%, for the number of traders willing to sell alcohol to underage young people are the worst in the County. A number of initiatives to lower this problem were discussed. These include identifying hotspot areas where youngsters gather to buy / drink alcohol; working with local media to highlight the issues and to inform people of how to report incidents, holding a mini TUSAC campaign in April / May. It was noted that funding of £2,500 is available from the current CDRP underspend to support a TUSAC style campaign.

It was decided to set up a restricted sales reporting hotline number and to advertise this to District Councillors and Parish / Town Councils

5. EFDC HOUSING SERVICE STRATEGY & STATEMENT ON ASB POLICIES & PROCEDURES

The final report was received by the Group. It was noted that this has now been formally adopted by Epping Forest District Council

6. NEW BIDS AND EVALUATION REPORTS RECEIVED

The evaluation report on the Essex Experience 2007 was circulated to the group prior to the meeting. It was noted that the 2007 event was particularly successful with 33 young people from Epping Forest attending. Teacher reports showed students improved their team building skills and self-confidence; greater enthusiasm for complying with Acceptable Behaviour Connacts was also recorded as a benefit of the event.

The Group agreed to support an application for funding for the 2008 event as and when received.

7. PROBLEM SOLVING

Updates on the problem solving actions were received and may be found as part of appendix 1 at the end of the minutes.

A verbal report on the Limes Farm Special Action Group meeting held on 6 December 2007 was provided. The LFSAG has divided into 3 subgroups looking at communications, environmental and social engagement issues. Particular issues being dealt with include the provision of a monitored CCTV system, a lighting site survey and environmental audit. The LF SAG will meet again on 31 January 2008.

I am employed by Essex Police and currently work on the Neighbourhood Policing Team at Waltham Abbey. I have held this position for two years. I supervise both Police officers and Police community support officers, all of whom work in Waltham Abbey. Through working in the town and speaking to my staff I can confirm that we receive reports from the public about nuisance youths. Often we have reports that groups of youths are hanging around certain areas in the evenings. The youths also have access to alcohol which serves to increase the problems further. Areas of concern in the town include, Sewardstone Road, Denny Avenue, Foxes parade, Broomstickhall Road and Larsens Park. All these areas are within a half mile radius of Farmhill Road. Anti-social behaviour reported is that the groups of youths make a lot of noise, leave litter around the area and cause criminal damage. Sewardstone Road has a Tescos supermarket where the youths hang around. They shove the trolleys all over the car park and cause trouble with the staff at this shop. Denny Avenue is a Cul-de-sac near to Tescos. Residents report groups of youths shouting and banging against the parked cars. Foxes parade is on the main road through the town. Reports are received that large groups hang around at the bus stop. They shout amongst themselves and push each other about. This causes annoyance to residents who live in the flats above the parade. Broomstickhall Road is a residential area where complaints have been received about groups of youths shouting and throwing things at passing cars. I would say that the most frequent complaints relate to Larsens Park, Honey Lane. This is a playing field with an enclosed childrens playground. Parents have reported that before they can allow their children into the playground they have to collect broken glass and bottles from the floor. Groundsmen report that they clear the area regularly but youths congregate and drink alcohol in the park on an almost nightly basis. Damage and graffitti has also been caused

In other areas youths have thrown eggs and fireworks at shops and houses. When people have gone out to speak to the youths they are often met with a torrent of abuse. The availability of alcohol seems to make the behaviour of the youths worse and when drunk they will encourage each other to behave in an anti-social manner.

At around 12:50 hours on Saturday the 29th of September 2007 I was on duty in full police uniform in the area of Waltham Abbey in Essex. At this time I was involved in a joint operation with Essex trading standards and due to this I attended a shop called Ozdil food that is located along Farm hill road in Waltham Abbey. I attended this location with an employee of Essex trading standards to issue a fixed penalty notice to the shop assistant who it was believed had just sold alcohol to a male who was under the age of 18 years.

At 12:58 hours on the same day I spoke to a male who I now know as Ozan KOROGLU d/o/b 24/03/1985, I said to KOROGLU "I AM REPORTING YOU FOR THE OFFENCE OF SELLING ALCOHOL TO A PERSON UNDER THE AGE OF 18". I then cautioned KOROGLU who made no reply. I then issued KOROGLU with an Essex Police penalty notice.







I have reviewed the evidence in respect to the sale of alcohol to a 16 year old on the 29th September 2007.

This sale was the result of a test purchase of your premises conducted by Trading Standards Officers. I note that in this instance a Penalty Notice for Disorder was issued to the cashier, having regard to this and all the circumstances there will be no further legal action taken by this department in respect of this sale.

However your premises will be tested again and should a further sale be made this department will consider further action either by way of requesting a license review or by instituting legal proceedings in the magistrates court.

As the premise license holder you need to ensure that the staff in your shop are competent to challenge children for 'proof of age' when they are attempting to purchase age restricted products. You are responsible for ensuring your staff are adequately trained and monitored.

I note that your premise has already had an advisory visit from officers of this department, where you were given advice notes, notices and other material to assist you and your staff. This service can offer further training or monitoring of your performance however we do have to cover our costs for these services.

4. TEST PURCHASING

Epping Forest figures, at 36%, for the number of traders willing to sell alcohol to underage young people are the worst in the County. A number of initiatives to lower this problem were discussed. support officers, all of whom work in Waitham Abbey. Through working in the town and speaking to my staff I can confirm that we receive reports								
from the public about nuisance youths.

On Saturday 13 th January 2007 I was on duty in full police uniform working on the Neighbourhood Policing Team based at Epping Police Station. I was tasked, on this day, with acompanying the Licensing Officer, Simion FISHER and colleagues from the Essex County Council Trading Standards Service as an operation was arranged with them to send in a person under the age of 18 into licenced premises, such as off licences, to see whether the employee would sell the purchaser alcohol. About 1330hrs I arrived at FARM HILL CONVENIENCE STORES, 93 FARM HILL ROAD, WALTHAM ABBEY, ESSEX, CM9 0AY. As I was in full Police Uniform I stayed around the corner from the shop so that I could not be seen.
