## PART 3(2) - RESPONSIBILITY FOR COUNCIL FUNCTIONS

#### LICENSING COMMITTEE - TERMS OF REFERENCE

- (1) The full Committee shall comprise 11 Councillors appointed by the Council at its annual meeting, including a Chairman and Vice-Chairman.
- (2) For the functions set out in Annex 1, and the legislation listed in Annex 2, a Sub-Committee consisting of no more than any three Councillors drawn, in alphabetical order, from the members of the full Committee shall be formed. Any such Sub-Committee shall elect a Chairman on an ad-hoc basis.
- (3) For the transaction of business at full Committee meetings, the quorum shall be a minimum of five Committee members save that no business shall be transacted unless either the Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the Committee is present.
- (4) The Committee and Sub-Committees shall have full authority to hear and determine licensing applications.
- (5) The Committee and Sub-Committees shall be further empowered to determine appeals made against the decisions of the Head of Environmental Services taken under delegated authority on licensing applications.
- (6) The Committee shall at all times carry out its duties solely within the policy from time to time determined by the Council and shall conduct its proceedings in accordance with the requirements set out in Annex 3 (Conduct of Business by Licensing Committee and Sub-Committees).
- (7) The Licensing Committee shall take no part in the production or revision of the statement of licensing policy made under Section 5 of the Licensing Act 2003, however, they may determine policy under the legislation listed in Annex 3.

# PART A – CONDUCT OF BUSINESS BY LICENSING COMMITTEE AND SUB-COMMITTEES

All references to committee in this annex shall be taken to infer a reference to the associated sub-committees.

#### 1. General Conduct

- 1.1 All hearings of the Licensing Committee under the Licensing Act 2003, are to be held in accordance with the Personal Licences, Hearings, Premises Licences and Club Premises Certificates, and Licensing Register Regulations, made under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2 The Council's Constitution shall regulate the conduct of and debate at meetings.
- 1.3 In the case of hearings under the Licensing Act 2003, the Committee shall only consider those matters relevant to the licensing objectives as set out in the Licensing Act 2003 and the statement of licensing policy adopted by the Council.

#### 2. Declarations of Interest

2.1 Members of the Committee are subject to the Council's Code of Conduct and to advice from the Standard Board for England, details of which will be provided to those members.

#### 3. Participation in the Hearing

- 3.1 Debate shall be restricted to members of the Licensing Committee. Where a local ward member, not being a member of the Committee, wishes to participate in the hearing, they may do so only with the permission of the Chairman and their participation shall be subject to the same rules as are applied to any other witnesses to the application.
- 3.2 In hearings other than those under the Licensing Act 2003, where a ward member is a member of the Committee, and wishes to object to the application, the member shall give 14 days' notice of their intention, and shall play no part in the decision-making process of the Committee. In hearings under the Licensing Act 2003, those named as responsible authorities and interested parties in the Act may only make representations within the time limits set out in the relevant statutory provisions.
- 3.3 All persons participating in the hearing shall be made aware of the limitations or scope of statements that will be acceptable and, in particular, that statements should be factual or a fair statement on a matter of public interest.

#### 4. Attendance of the Public

4.1 The Council's Constitution and relevant statutory provisions relating to the admission or exclusion of the public shall apply to all meetings of the Licensing Committee.

#### 5. Natural Justice

5.1 There are two elements to natural justice:

#### (a) Fairness

- (i) All persons affected by the decision or in the case of matters associated with the Licensing Act 2003, those named as responsible authorities and interested parties in the Act, will be allowed a hearing before a decision is made.
- (ii) Only objectors who can show clearly that they are affected by a decision shall be afforded the right to be heard or, in the case of hearings under the Licensing Act 2003, only those named in the Act as responsible authorities or interested parties.
- (iii) All information shall be made available, where possible in advance, to the applicant and the Committee.
- (iv) All members of the Committee shall be present throughout the hearing of a particular application. Where a member arrives late or leaves during a hearing of a particular application, that member shall play no part in the decision-making process. Where an application is adjourned it shall be continued by the same members only, and no others.
- (v) The Committee shall have discretion in respect of 'late' objections. Such objections shall be clearly marked on the agenda as such and the Committee shall decide on their acceptability. The applicant shall be advised of any late objections. In the case of representations made in relation to the Licensing Act 2003 applications, these shall only be accepted in accordance with the relevant statutory provisions.

#### (b) Prevention of Bias

- (i) The rules on the declarations of interest shall be firmly applied.
- (ii) If the Committee moves into private session to consider its decision, it shall be accompanied only by its advising officers, none of whom shall have taken a substantive part in the hearing, and shall play no substantive part in the decision-making process.

### 6. General Procedures for Hearings

- 6.1 The following procedural requirements shall be followed at all times:
  - (a) There shall be no recommendation from officers on the agenda;
  - (b) The Committee shall be supplied with copies of all relevant documentation and the process and order of procedure shall be as follows:
    - (i) The Chairman will open the meeting and introduce persons as appropriate asking applicants and representatives to identify themselves.
    - (ii) The Chairman will outline the procedure to be followed.

- (iii) The Lead Officer will outline the matter in hand.
- (iv) The applicant or representative will present his/her case, with or without witnesses, and be questioned by members or any objectors/persons making representations present.
- (v) Any objectors/persons making representations may then present their objections/representation, with or without witnesses, and be questioned by members or the applicant/s or their representative.
- (vi) The objectors/persons making representations may make a final statement (without introducing new issues).
- (vii) Finally, the applicant has the right to make a final statement (without introducing new issues).
- (viii) All evidence/disclosures are to be made in the presence of all persons, unless someone voluntarily excuses themselves from the proceedings.
- (ix) Committee members shall restrict themselves to questions and not discussion or comment.
- (x) The applicant, objectors/persons making representations shall be allowed to ask officers questions of a technical/factual nature at any time during the proceedings.
- (xi) An adjournment should be granted where to do otherwise would deny a fair hearing.
- (xii) The Committee may resolve to decide upon the application in private session, however, if it becomes necessary to recall anyone for additional information, everyone shall be invited to return to the Hearing.
- (xiii) The decision shall be given in the presence of all parties that wish to be present and confirmed in writing as soon as possible thereafter. If legal advice is given to members this advice will be repeated in summary form.

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

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

On behalf of the Council's Environmental Protection Team (Pollution Control), I confirm receipt of a copy of your application dated 13<sup>th</sup> February 2006 that I received on 14<sup>th</sup> February 2006 regarding the above mentioned property.

Although the applicant is providing door supervisors for events, they have failed to show insufficient measures to contain loud amplified music from the premises. In light of this I have made the following representation to the Council's Licensing Section with regard to the Licensing objective — Prevention of Public nuisance:

1. The Premises Supervisor (or representative) shall monitor the volume of music emanating from the premises and adjust the volume to ensure that any amplified sound or other music from the licensed premises does not cause a public nuisance. The Premises Supervisor (or representative) can ensure that music from the premises does not cause a public nuisance by ensuring that the music is inaudible at the boundary of any properties where the occupiers are likely to be sensitive to noise.

Reason: To ensure that any music and amplified sound from the licensed premises does not cause a public nuisance.

I should be happy to withdraw the representation(s) if the operating schedule is amended accordingly or if you agree to a suitable condition(s) being imposed as part of the licence, or if you provide sufficient evidence to confirm that the representation can be withdrawn.

I understand that Minx of 126 High Road, Loughton has applied to extend its Licensing hours. I wish to object to this for the following reasons.

Problems with excessive alcohol consumption can be directly related to crime and disorder; opening longer is likely to make this worse rather than better. Furthermore, there is no public transport, leading to larger numbers in the streets at a time when Police presence will not be as great as it is at other times.

There are problems already relating to noise from these types of premises and noise associated with the movement of cars very late at night, (or in this case in the early hours of the morning). This will become more of an issue during the summer months when bedroom or other windows are more likely to be open than they are now.

I appreciate that the council has to operate within the recent legislation, but would hope that Members will realise that the potential impact of extending opening hours of these premises, and the knock-on effect on similar premises within the vicinity, will have a major detrimental effect on the largely residential area around these premises. I ask that these considerations should be given a higher priority than the increase in profits from longer opening hours that will also result in increases in anti-social behaviour.







Please be aware that we wish to raise our objections to the proposed extended licensing hours. We object on the grounds of:

- 1. <u>Public safety.</u> We currently note broken bottles and a pool of vomit near Minx, both of these pose a huge risk. Falls, slips and trips over the glass and vomit have the potential to cause wounds, fractures and psychological distress to local residents. Increased drinking time is likely to increase the number of broken bottles and pools of vomit.
- 2. <u>Public nuisance</u>. Every Friday and Saturday nights witness rowdy behaviour by young adults and loud verbal disagreements by couples shortly after closing time. We anticipate extended licensing hours will ensure these public nuisances will occur later in the evening and for a longer period of time.

The majority of car parking for the Minx establishment takes place in the side roads around the rear in the various side roads, especially Smarts Lane. 





Are you also aware that part of the public pavement is cordoned off and a red carpet laid near the entrance to the bar making it difficult to walk past the bouncers in the evening?





Further to our telephone conversation yesterday, following various discussions with Liz Cox within your department and Simon Fisher of Essex Police over the past two days.

Not only are we extremely upset that the above public house, is attempting to emulate our licensing hours, and trading practices, of which they have their own group of clientele and us ours, have since taken our disc jockey's and one of our live bands namely the 'Diamond Girls', which as a family feel this totally underhanded and an absolutely a despicable disgrace, of which we will be contacting the establishment and manageress directly, and further feel they have disgraced any gentlemanly agreement within the local licensed establishments, if there were any? and furthermore any community working practices.

Last year myself and my family had purchased our business in May 05 (Half Moon High St) we understood that the local Public Houses, and authorities all worked together? not as in practice it seems, with maverick established premises doing exactly whatever they feel?

After bringing the issue that concerned us to your department, that the George & Dragon is trading without the correct musical entertainment licence to do so, therefore is breaking the licensing law, of which they have applied for a variation on their existing licence on the 23<sup>rd</sup> Feb 06, which has not been issued to date.

Mar 2<sup>nd</sup> after the letter was hand delivered.

The manageress after being telephoned by Simon Fisher of Essex Police, and again by EFDC the two authorities have been led to believe by the manageress of the establishment that the whole issue is some oversight, and they will cancel the Thursday night live events until her licence is approved, with the exception of the establishment now applying for a TEN notice for the 23<sup>rd</sup> Mar 06, after already committing two offences on the 26<sup>th</sup> Feb and 2<sup>nd</sup> Mar respectively having live entertainment of which is publicised on the front of the Public House and give away flyers ( one now in the hands of Liz Cox of your office ), and has a good chance of actually getting her TEN notice granted, making a complete mockery of the Local Licensing Authority, which will set a president for any future disputes from any further source within your jurisdiction.

All of this before her variation licence is considered, now by a hearing I would trust?, of which we will attend with representation, after being forwarded the details from yourselves, of when the board will consider the judgement, and would strongly urge the authority to strongly consider restricting any additional hours requested, and the use of live entertainment altogether after the two current misdemeanants.

Finally, all of the above had transpired, prior to contacting yourself, who actually listened to myself and my families concerns and grievances, although I would further add that Liz has herself been very helpful indeed, of which we are extremely grateful, from myself and my family who run the Half Moon PH.
