### PART 3(2) - RESPONSIBILITY FOR COUNCIL FUNCTIONS

#### LICENSING COMMITTEE - TERMS OF REFERENCE

- (1) The full Committee shall comprise 11 Councillors appointed by the Council at its annual meeting, including a Chairman and Vice-Chairman.
- (2) For the functions set out in Annex 1, and the legislation listed in Annex 2, a Sub-Committee consisting of no more than any three Councillors drawn, in alphabetical order, from the members of the full Committee shall be formed. Any such Sub-Committee shall elect a Chairman on an ad-hoc basis.
- (3) For the transaction of business at full Committee meetings, the quorum shall be a minimum of five Committee members save that no business shall be transacted unless either the Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the Committee is present.
- (4) The Committee and Sub-Committees shall have full authority to hear and determine licensing applications.
- (5) The Committee and Sub-Committees shall be further empowered to determine appeals made against the decisions of the Head of Environmental Services taken under delegated authority on licensing applications.
- (6) The Committee shall at all times carry out its duties solely within the policy from time to time determined by the Council and shall conduct its proceedings in accordance with the requirements set out in Annex 3 (Conduct of Business by Licensing Committee and Sub-Committees).
- (7) The Licensing Committee shall take no part in the production or revision of the statement of licensing policy made under Section 5 of the Licensing Act 2003, however, they may determine policy under the legislation listed in Annex 3.

## PART A – CONDUCT OF BUSINESS BY LICENSING COMMITTEE AND SUB-COMMITTEES

All references to committee in this annex shall be taken to infer a reference to the associated sub-committees.

#### 1. General Conduct

- 1.1 All hearings of the Licensing Committee under the Licensing Act 2003, are to be held in accordance with the Personal Licences, Hearings, Premises Licences and Club Premises Certificates, and Licensing Register Regulations, made under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2 The Council's Constitution shall regulate the conduct of and debate at meetings.
- 1.3 In the case of hearings under the Licensing Act 2003, the Committee shall only consider those matters relevant to the licensing objectives as set out in the Licensing Act 2003 and the statement of licensing policy adopted by the Council.

#### 2. Declarations of Interest

2.1 Members of the Committee are subject to the Council's Code of Conduct and to advice from the Standard Board for England, details of which will be provided to those members.

#### 3. Participation in the Hearing

- 3.1 Debate shall be restricted to members of the Licensing Committee. Where a local ward member, not being a member of the Committee, wishes to participate in the hearing, they may do so only with the permission of the Chairman and their participation shall be subject to the same rules as are applied to any other witnesses to the application.
- 3.2 In hearings other than those under the Licensing Act 2003, where a ward member is a member of the Committee, and wishes to object to the application, the member shall give 14 days' notice of their intention, and shall play no part in the decision-making process of the Committee. In hearings under the Licensing Act 2003, those named as responsible authorities and interested parties in the Act may only make representations within the time limits set out in the relevant statutory provisions.
- 3.3 All persons participating in the hearing shall be made aware of the limitations or scope of statements that will be acceptable and, in particular, that statements should be factual or a fair statement on a matter of public interest.

#### 4. Attendance of the Public

4.1 The Council's Constitution and relevant statutory provisions relating to the admission or exclusion of the public shall apply to all meetings of the Licensing Committee.

#### 5. Natural Justice

5.1 There are two elements to natural justice:

#### (a) Fairness

- (i) All persons affected by the decision or in the case of matters associated with the Licensing Act 2003, those named as responsible authorities and interested parties in the Act, will be allowed a hearing before a decision is made.
- (ii) Only objectors who can show clearly that they are affected by a decision shall be afforded the right to be heard or, in the case of hearings under the Licensing Act 2003, only those named in the Act as responsible authorities or interested parties.
- (iii) All information shall be made available, where possible in advance, to the applicant and the Committee.
- (iv) All members of the Committee shall be present throughout the hearing of a particular application. Where a member arrives late or leaves during a hearing of a particular application, that member shall play no part in the decision-making process. Where an application is adjourned it shall be continued by the same members only, and no others.
- (v) The Committee shall have discretion in respect of 'late' objections. Such objections shall be clearly marked on the agenda as such and the Committee shall decide on their acceptability. The applicant shall be advised of any late objections. In the case of representations made in relation to the Licensing Act 2003 applications, these shall only be accepted in accordance with the relevant statutory provisions.

#### (b) Prevention of Bias

- (i) The rules on the declarations of interest shall be firmly applied.
- (ii) If the Committee moves into private session to consider its decision, it shall be accompanied only by its advising officers, none of whom shall have taken a substantive part in the hearing, and shall play no substantive part in the decision-making process.

#### 6. General Procedures for Hearings

- 6.1 The following procedural requirements shall be followed at all times:
  - (a) There shall be no recommendation from officers on the agenda;
  - (b) The Committee shall be supplied with copies of all relevant documentation and the process and order of procedure shall be as follows:
    - (i) The Chairman will open the meeting and introduce persons as appropriate asking applicants and representatives to identify themselves.
    - (ii) The Chairman will outline the procedure to be followed.

- (iii) The Lead Officer will outline the matter in hand.
- (iv) The applicant or representative will present his/her case, with or without witnesses, and be questioned by members or any objectors/persons making representations present.
- (v) Any objectors/persons making representations may then present their objections/representation, with or without witnesses, and be questioned by members or the applicant/s or their representative.
- (vi) The objectors/persons making representations may make a final statement (without introducing new issues).
- (vii) Finally, the applicant has the right to make a final statement (without introducing new issues).
- (viii) All evidence/disclosures are to be made in the presence of all persons, unless someone voluntarily excuses themselves from the proceedings.
- (ix) Committee members shall restrict themselves to questions and not discussion or comment.
- (x) The applicant, objectors/persons making representations shall be allowed to ask officers questions of a technical/factual nature at any time during the proceedings.
- (xi) An adjournment should be granted where to do otherwise would deny a fair hearing.
- (xii) The Committee may resolve to decide upon the application in private session, however, if it becomes necessary to recall anyone for additional information, everyone shall be invited to return to the Hearing.
- (xiii) The decision shall be given in the presence of all parties that wish to be present and confirmed in writing as soon as possible thereafter. If legal advice is given to members this advice will be repeated in summary form.

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

This letter is with respect to the application for an Extended Licence for the Three Colts Public House at 54 Princes Road, Buckhurst Hill.

We feel very strongly that to extend the hours of opening beyond 11.00 p.m. is unacceptable for a number of reasons:

- The Three Colts Public House is in a heavy populated residential area with houses totally surrounding it. Unlike some other public houses that have a little space around them, the Three Colts has no space between itself and the adjacent properties.
- Princes Road is extremely narrow and is constantly occupied by resident's parked cars.
- Extended hours would encourage more customers, some potentially with cars, causing further congestion in this already crowded road.
- We feel the noise levels with potentially rowdy customers spilling out of the premises very late at night and into the early hours of the morning would be totally unacceptable.
- Extended licensing hours would remove the small, country pub atmosphere and encourage a younger and, probably more rowdy clientel.
- Extended hours of opening could lead to a higher level of alcohol consumption and the potential for more drunken anti social behaviour.

In principle, our main objections are on point 1 (extension of hours for the sale of alcohol during the week and weekend) and point 3, regarding Regulated Entertainment (not specified).

Enquiries to:

Our concerns are as follows:

- The public house does not have a car park and residential parking is a big issue on Princes Road, so much so that I understand we are pursuing a scheme to create a Residential Scheme in the near future
- The pub is surrounded by residential properties, which I believe would be disturbed during week nights and at the weekend. I also believe this would be compounded by the above premises becoming a destination for late night drinkers in the area, again I don't believe this would be appropriate, given the location of the pub
- The pub is also in the close proximately of a children's playground, which can become a destination for youths after the pub closure. An example of how this has led to anti-social behaviour would be when we have recently witnessed a fire started in the playground in December 2005, which resulted in the attendance of the police and fire brigade

We do not object to an increase in the licensing times during Bank Holidays or Special occasions, but do not believe that our 'local country pub' on the edge of Lord's Bushes and positioned within a residential street should be granted a unilateral extension to the licensing hours both during the week and at weekends.



The Three Colts does not have its own parking area and were this extended licensing application to be granted, we should suffer disturbance into the early hours.



Our home is almost at the junction of Forest Edge and Princes Road and we have lived here for some 22 years.

We were horrified to see the notice to vary the licence for "The Three Colts" in the local paper. Other than the Evangelical Church, this is the only "business" in Princes Road, and any further extension of its opening hours, or type of entertainment provided, would be completely out of place in our opinion.

We already suffer from time to time, but especially in the summer, with weekend late night noise, shouting, running in the street, kicking our access way gates and neighbours' fences, (occasionally breaking them). We have not previously made any complaints in the interests of "live and let live". However, we strongly object to these new proposals, which we feel can only increase this type of nuisance. We base this on what has happened with other venues in the vicinity where they have been permitted to increase their activities, even where they have provided "Security" to their premises. 

I oppose Mr. Heek's proposed license variations, specifically the extended opening hours and live entertainment. These plans are entirely inappropriate in a compact, densly populated residential area with many young families.

The Three Colts' requested variance fails to meet your licensing policy objectives:

#### The prevention of public nuisance

The extended hours, and live entertainment are intended to increase traffic into the Three Colts. This not only puts pressure on the local parking, but it will also bring more minicabs onto the street at an even later hour, with their honking, hooting, and doors slamming. Residents will also hear more people clattering out of the Three Colts in high spirits at an even later hour.

#### 2. The prevention of crime and disorder

The police already find it difficult to maintain order in our area of Buckhurst Hill. Adding late night drinking to the area will further stretch police resources and exacerbate existing problems. Two examples: 1) The Kings Avenue children's play area, less than 100 meters from the Three Colts, is presently being vandalised on a weekly basis (including arson, tearing up the protective play surface, and actually stealing park benches.) The Buckhurst Hill Parish Council Information Office keeps records of these abuses for your reference. 2) The area around the tube station is also out of control. The new bus stop has had the glass completely smashed-out twice now.

#### 3. Public safety / The protection of children from harm

Broken glass on the pavements and in the playground is already a risk to children in our area. Late night drinking in the area would increase this problem, especially if drinkers wander from one of the other bars only a block away to continue drinking.

Additionally, the Three Colts has no off-street parking of any kind. This means more cars are parked on the street and some pub customers leave their cars parked on the street for several days before they can return to collect them. As parking gets tighter, it becomes difficult for dirivers to see children stepping out onto the street and for children to safely see oncoming cars from the pavement.

In short, the license variance that the Three Colts is seeking would not enhance the local community, instead it would attract people from outside the area for the purpose of late night drinking. This would be appropriate for an urban centre but would be very unfair on local residents of a suburban area like Buckhurst Hill.

I understand that Mr.Heeks of the Three Colts has applied for an extension of opening hours which I wish to strenuously oppose.

Apart from the pub, the area in which we live is entirely residential. I have had to complain to the previous landlord on a number of occasions because of the disturbance late at night caused be minicabs collecting customers. He merely stated, accurately, that "he could not control drivers". As you know there is no private parking available for pub customers, and the streets around here are narrow and already full with residents cars. Minicabs are ordered by customers and have to wait outside in the middle of the road, blocking traffic, as there is nowhere else for them to wait. According to the minicab companies, the drivers are instructed, for safety reasons, to stay in their cars and they therefore sound their horns to notify the customer of their arrival (they do not use their mobile phones because the customer will not hear it in the noise of the pub). This causes noise and disturbance in the streets, and more for my family because we face the pub.

In addition, because customers often drink more alcohol than they anticipated they leave their cars parked over night and sometimes for a few days, very often blocking the drive to my garage. I regularly arrive home from work late and leave early in the morning and this can be of great inconvenience to me.

Also, if the opening hours are to be extended this will cause a considerable increase in the noise coming from the garden at the rear of the pub.

Whilst I accept that a pub has stood on this site for a number of years, it is already impossible to properly regulate and police the disturbance caused – whatever Mr.Heeks reassurances to the contrary.

These proposals will merely benefit customers coming into the area for late drinks and in particular increase the landlord's profit.



## The Three Colts, Buckhurst Hill Application for Variation of Premises Licensing Hours

I note with some alarm the Public Notice regarding the application for extended licensing hours for The Three Colts at number 54 in this road and wish to record my objection to, specifically, one of the changes proposed.

After living at the above address for nearly fifty years I have been well aware of the changes which have taken place in and around our 'local' and can see that extending the current closing time to 12.30 am during the week (Monday-Friday) and to 1.30 am weekends will not be serving any useful or needed service to the local community.

I, along with a number of neighbours with whom I have conversed, take the view that after a night's drinking, patrons will be less than mindful of the respect due to surrounding residents. I refer particularly to the noise created at 'turning out time'. As no parking facilities are available at the premises, cars would probably be distributed along Forest Edge and Princes Road — where kerb-parking space is constantly at a premium - or, in the case of motorcycles, even onto forest land. As a consequence vehicles departing from this essentially residential area at all hours up to and after closing times are hardly likely to go quietly.

Whilst I have no objection to the extension of licensing hours on recognized holidays etc. as specified in the application, I do feel that there are too many negative aspects to this week-day/weekend proposal:

- (1) lack of justifiable motive; (local residents are not demanding this facility);
- (2) noise even though the present landlord aims to run an orderly house;
- (3) parking for reasons stated above and
- (4) the possibility of off-premises misbehaviour (including the possibility of damage to local property and parked cars).

To whom it may concern:

I am writing with regard to the above application to extend the opening hours and particular reference to points 1 and 3.

I have lived across the street for some years now, and of course some noise should be expected as it is a public house but unfortunately during the last 12 months particularly it has been increasingly noisy and harder to obtain a peaceful nights sleep.

Drinkers gather outside the pub, in the streets, damaging cars when intoxicated, often having fights, breaking bottles and glasses, throwing litter in neighbours gardens, and bringing excess traffic to a street that already has limited availability of parking for residents. It is extremely noisy in the evenings between 11.00 and 11.30 pm when residents are trying to sleep, and on a few occasions I have had to go outside and politely ask for consideration, as it is residential area. 

As the owner of 58 Princes Road, my house is 50 yards from The Three Colts public house, 54 Princes Road, Buckhurst Hill, IG9 5EE.

I was on the point of writing to object to the application by Gary David Heeks, however, he has sent a clarification of his application by general letter to all local residents – I attach a copy. Taking what he says at face value, I make the following observations:

- I accept his assurance that the application is 'primarily for the addition of a restaurant'. If so, however, I cannot understand why he seeks to sell alcohol until 1.30am at weekends, or indeed, for extended hours at Bank Holidays and other limited days.
- 2. He says that he intends 'no live music or the like', but what Regulated Entertainment does he actually propose?

A simple extension of hours to permit the proper operation of a restaurant does not require the extensions that the application suggests. As he protests that he requires no more than that, I ask that should any permission be given, it reflect his expressed assurances.

We feel very strongly that to extend the hours of opening beyond 11.00 p.m. is unacceptable for a number of reasons:

- The Three Colts Public House is in a heavy populated residential area with houses totally surrounding it. Unlike some other public houses that have a little space around them, the Three Colts has no space between itself and the adjacent properties.
- Princes Road is extremely narrow and is constantly occupied by resident's parked cars.

I refer to the application by Mr.G.D.Heeks and wish to make the following objections to the proposed variations:-

General disturbance

All of the proposals fall outside the essential nature of the surrounding area. The Three Colts is the only business in Princes Road, which is otherwise entirely residential. Any increase in the hours during which the pub is open will inevitably lead to an increase in traffic, noise, and disturbance to the surrounding houses. Please bear in mind that many of the local houses are terraced with short front gardens and any noise reverberates up and down Princes Road itself. This problem is further exacerbated during summer months.

Traffic and parking

There are no public transport facilities available during the hours applied for and the pub has no car park available. Moreover, the bottom end of Princes Road is the subject of a new restricted parking scheme which is due to be implemented later this year. We can ill afford any increase in local traffic and parking for whatever reason.

Increased trade during the extended hours will lead to an increase in mini-cabs and their associated disturbance (i.e. engines running while waiting, hooting, car doors slamming etc.). In the absence of public transport drinking and driving can only be encouraged.

Policing

It is evident that local policing is inadequate and already stretched to the limit. Buckhurst Hill in general, and Princes Road/Kings Place in particular, are areas already suffering from the lack of police presence. Particularly at the weekends the area is plagued with large numbers of youths swarming the streets and spilling over in the forest behind the pub. Despite an application by the Buckhurst Hill Town Centre Partnership there is no appropriate Dispersal Order placed on Buckhurst Hill Station, with the result that large numbers of youths from outlying areas congregate in Buckhurst Hill. No satisfactory policing exists to deal with the problem so how can we expect any difficulties arising from the pub to be dealt with?



I would like to register my very strong objections to the proposals (dated 7<sup>th</sup> April 2006) set out in the local paper, regarding changes to the uses and hours of the **Three Colts** at 54, Princes Road, Buckhurst Hill.

The street in which it is situated is purely residential, away from the main street (Queen's Road). Queen's Road has shops and businesses so is largely unoccupied at night. There is allocated parking, but despite this the pavement is frequently blocked by parked cars whose owners are in the Blue Monday bar. The situation could only be much worse in Prince's Road. It is a busy road currently, with heavy vehicles only just able to pass. There is a proposal to introduce residents-only parking in Prince's Road and the surrounding area; how will patrons be able to park at the extended venue which has no car park and is surrounded by residential parking only?

In addition, as it is heavily residential, the constant noise from late opening and loud entertainment will disrupt and lower the quality of life for everyone who lives nearby. Occasional extensions for special occasions are not unreasonable, but it is not the type of area where a late night, 'party' venue should be situated.

The environs have a wonderful country feel to them with the close location to forest walks in Lord's Bushes; the Three Colts has been an excellent 'quiet country pub' so far. We write to strongly support the application for a variation of the licence of the above premises and to disassociate the residents of Princes Road from the anonymous circular which purported to speak on our behalf and objected to the granting of this licence.

The present licensee has turned what was a down-at-heel, grubby establishment into a clean, well-run and popular local public house in a very short space of time. He has driven out the groups of under-aged drinkers who used to gather in the bar and begun the process of changing this into what will, we are sure, become a very popular local eating and drinking establishment. His plans to develop the garden and restaurant area show that he is looking to build up family trade — exactly what this area needs.

The new management under Mr Heeks has shown a sensitivity to the local residents which the previous managers never reached – they have redecorated it inside and out! The exterior no longer resembles an ancient coaching inn from a bad horror movie. The toilets are clean and the wiring no longer looks like it will electrocute the bar staff at any moment.

To compare, as the anonymous leaflet does, The Three Colts as a parking problem waiting to happen similar to the parking problems Blue Monday caused is very disingenuous. Blue Monday is a trendy bar where young folk like to show off their flashy cars. (And there's nothing wrong with that). However, you cannot compare Blue Monday to a family pub. The clientele is totally different. Blue Monday's clientele is mostly from outside of Buckhurst Hill. The Three Colts' customers are mostly locals who travel no further than a few streets away.

To say that The Three Colts is, "...our quiet country pub...' as the anonymous leaflet does is bizarre. It's in the middle of a town – not the middle of a field! So it's always had some customers who arrive by car. To say that many more will do so is guess work and alarmist. To deny a licence on those grounds would instantly shut down the Railway Tavern – despite the fact it is opposite a BR car park - it does **not** have its **own** car park.

Anyone who tries to paint the people who frequent The Three Colts as 'anti-social' has obviously never been in the pub – not even the old bunch of 'regulars' ever carried out an anti-social act in the five years I've lived in Princes Road. To claim that this license application would lead to anti-social behaviour is a slightly hysterical reaction.

The allegations that parking will worsen is a Red Herring. The parking problems are caused because there are no proper parking regulations in place in our area. The council has plans in hand and these, not phantom armies of fictional London Pridecrazed Three Colts drivers, will solve parking our dilemmas.

Let's look at some facts:-


- Since the new management took over they have taken a responsible attitude to under-age drinking

I refer to your correspondence dated 28 April 2006, received 2 May, concerning the above.

Please be aware that Essex County Council wishes to raise an objection to the granting of a renewal of a Street Trading Consent at this location.

The grounds for this being:

- The indiscriminate parking of vehicles, especially Heavy Goods Vehicles, attracted to the facility significantly impedes the safe passage of traffic in the immediate vicinity.
- The lawful use of private accesses on to the highway in the vicinity is severely restricted both in terms of physical obstruction and the obstruction of sight lines.
- There is no safe provision for persons to cross the highway. The site of the facility is on a busy stretch of principal road where driver attention is being distracted by the parking on both sides, oncoming vehicles and vehicles manoeuvring. I am writing to you with reference to the above application for the renewal of a Street Trading consent, as I wish to comment on this particular case.

As you know, this Trader is situated between the two roundabouts at junction 26 for the M25 on the main highway, which gives access and egress to the M25.

Over the past two years this Trader has caused numerous highway safety issues, with HGV's some with trailers double parking, using up completely both sides of the road, they also park under the motorway bridge, which in turn has led to damage to the footpaths and kerbs, and restricts other vehicles vision as they approach the roundabout. This inconsiderate parking (especially at night-time) has caused normal traffic using this part of the road great difficulty in manoeuvring along this stretch of busy highway. Secondly, residents and their friends that live adjacent to this trader, take their life into their hands when they try to enter or leave their properties, they have to pull out to the centre of the road, because, their vision is blocked by parked vehicles.

#### Re: Rebels Diner/Snack Bar Licensing

Further to our telephone conversation today regarding the licensing of a snack bar to the north of Honey Lane.

As landowners and on behalf of tenants and residents on Skillet Hill Farm, we object to the street trading licence for the following reasons:

- 1. Highways/Road Safety the hours of operation are approximately five-six in the evening through to four am. During the week this attracts a considerable amount of HGV's that park on grass verges and pavements which are not suitable and subsequently have considerable damage. Pedestrians moving in and around the parked lorries crossing the road present a risk to other road users. During the weekends there are young revellers returning from evening entertainment venues; which pose a different risk to other road users.
- 2. Environmental and Pollution there are no toilet facilities for customers whom use what resources are available; grass verges and the copps to the south of Honey Lane. There is a considerable amount of rats and although the snack bar may not be the sole cause of the infestations, the lack of toilets and litter bins in between both roundabouts may have an effect on the amount of infestations in and around the water/sewage systems in the woods, directly to the south of Honey Lane. Perhaps, further investigation is needed to find the exact cause.

3. Crime – Due to the established location, ample parking along the highway and the effect of refreshments available, this makes the location a convenient place for criminal behaviour; often of an evening exchange of goods between vehicles takes place. Most recently the police investigation into the murder in High Beech revealed that the victim was met of an evening in Honey Lane.

It is for the above reasons, landowners and tenants of Skillet Hill Farm feel the license should be either decided at a formal hearing or refused. We would request to be informed of any future public hearings.

Should the council be minded to grant a new licence, we have suggested a number of conditions that could be imposed which would at least go some way to making the operation acceptable.

- Highway improvements and parking restrictions, hours of operation to cease at 11pm.
- 2. Toilet facilities should be provided.
- 3. Improved litter picking and bins between both roundabouts.
- 4. CCTV to prevent criminal behaviour.
- 5. Pest preventions increased.

I await your response in due course.
