PART 3(2) - RESPONSIBILITY FOR COUNCIL FUNCTIONS

LICENSING COMMITTEE – TERMS OF REFERENCE

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(1) The full Committee shall comprise 11 Councillors appointed by the Council at its annual meeting, including a Chairman and Vice-Chairman.

(2) For the functions set out in Annex 1, and the legislation listed in Annex 2, a Sub-Committee consisting of no more than any three Councillors drawn, in alphabetical order, from the members of the full Committee shall be formed. Any such Sub-Committee shall elect a Chairman on an ad-hoc basis.

(3) For the transaction of business at full Committee meetings, the quorum shall be a minimum of five Committee members save that no business shall be transacted unless either the Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the Committee is present.

(4) The Committee and Sub-Committees shall have full authority to hear and determine licensing applications.

(5) The Committee and Sub-Committees shall be further empowered to determine appeals made against the decisions of the Head of Environmental Services taken under delegated authority on licensing applications.

(6) The Committee shall at all times carry out its duties solely within the policy from time to time determined by the Council and shall conduct its proceedings in accordance with the requirements set out in Annex 3 (Conduct of Business by Licensing Committee and Sub-Committees).

(7) The Licensing Committee shall take no part in the production or revision of the statement of licensing policy made under Section 5 of the Licensing Act 2003, however, they may determine policy under the legislation listed in Annex 3.

PART A – CONDUCT OF BUSINESS BY LICENSING COMMITTEE AND SUB-COMMITTEES

All references to committee in this annex shall be taken to infer a reference to the associated sub-committees.

1. General Conduct

- 1.1 All hearings of the Licensing Committee under the Licensing Act 2003, are to be held in accordance with the Personal Licences, Hearings, Premises Licences and Club Premises Certificates, and Licensing Register Regulations, made under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2 The Council's Constitution shall regulate the conduct of and debate at meetings.
- 1.3 In the case of hearings under the Licensing Act 2003, the Committee shall only consider those matters relevant to the licensing objectives as set out in the Licensing Act 2003 and the statement of licensing policy adopted by the Council.

2. Declarations of Interest

2.1 Members of the Committee are subject to the Council's Code of Conduct and to advice from the Standard Board for England, details of which will be provided to those members.

3. Participation in the Hearing

- 3.1 Debate shall be restricted to members of the Licensing Committee. Where a local ward member, not being a member of the Committee, wishes to participate in the hearing, they may do so only with the permission of the Chairman and their participation shall be subject to the same rules as are applied to any other witnesses to the application.
- 3.2 In hearings other than those under the Licensing Act 2003, where a ward member is a member of the Committee, and wishes to object to the application, the member shall give 14 days' notice of their intention, and shall play no part in the decision-making process of the Committee. In hearings under the Licensing Act 2003, those named as responsible authorities and interested parties in the Act may only make representations within the time limits set out in the relevant statutory provisions.
- 3.3 All persons participating in the hearing shall be made aware of the limitations or scope of statements that will be acceptable and, in particular, that statements should be factual or a fair statement on a matter of public interest.

4. Attendance of the Public

4.1 The Council's Constitution and relevant statutory provisions relating to the admission or exclusion of the public shall apply to all meetings of the Licensing Committee.

5. Natural Justice

5.1 There are two elements to natural justice:

(a) Fairness

- (i) All persons affected by the decision or in the case of matters associated with the Licensing Act 2003, those named as responsible authorities and interested parties in the Act, will be allowed a hearing before a decision is made.
- (ii) Only objectors who can show clearly that they are affected by a decision shall be afforded the right to be heard or, in the case of hearings under the Licensing Act 2003, only those named in the Act as responsible authorities or interested parties.
- (iii) All information shall be made available, where possible in advance, to the applicant and the Committee.
- (iv) All members of the Committee shall be present throughout the hearing of a particular application. Where a member arrives late or leaves during a hearing of a particular application, that member shall play no part in the decision-making process. Where an application is adjourned it shall be continued by the same members only, and no others.
- (v) The Committee shall have discretion in respect of 'late' objections. Such objections shall be clearly marked on the agenda as such and the Committee shall decide on their acceptability. The applicant shall be advised of any late objections. In the case of representations made in relation to the Licensing Act 2003 applications, these shall only be accepted in accordance with the relevant statutory provisions.

(b) Prevention of Bias

- (i) The rules on the declarations of interest shall be firmly applied.
- (ii) If the Committee moves into private session to consider its decision, it shall be accompanied only by its advising officers, none of whom shall have taken a substantive part in the hearing, and shall play no substantive part in the decision-making process.

6. General Procedures for Hearings

- 6.1 The following procedural requirements shall be followed at all times:
 - (a) There shall be no recommendation from officers on the agenda;
 - (b) The Committee shall be supplied with copies of all relevant documentation and the process and order of procedure shall be as follows:
 - (i) The Chairman will open the meeting and introduce persons as appropriate asking applicants and representatives to identify themselves.
 - (ii) The Chairman will outline the procedure to be followed.

- (iii) The Lead Officer will outline the matter in hand.
- (iv) The applicant or representative will present his/her case, with or without witnesses, and be questioned by members or any objectors/persons making representations present.
- (v) Any objectors/persons making representations may then present their objections/representation, with or without witnesses, and be questioned by members or the applicant/s or their representative.
- (vi) The objectors/persons making representations may make a final statement (without introducing new issues).
- (vii) Finally, the applicant has the right to make a final statement (without introducing new issues).
- (viii) All evidence/disclosures are to be made in the presence of all persons, unless someone voluntarily excuses themselves from the proceedings.
- (ix) Committee members shall restrict themselves to questions and not discussion or comment.
- (x) The applicant, objectors/persons making representations shall be allowed to ask officers questions of a technical/factual nature at any time during the proceedings.
- (xi) An adjournment should be granted where to do otherwise would deny a fair hearing.
- (xii) The Committee may resolve to decide upon the application in private session, however, if it becomes necessary to recall anyone for additional information, everyone shall be invited to return to the Hearing.
- (xiii) The decision shall be given in the presence of all parties that wish to be present and confirmed in writing as soon as possible thereafter. If legal advice is given to members this advice will be repeated in summary form.



I am not a kill-joy and actively supported the application by the Royal Oak pub in Loughton recently and I do believe people should socialise and have fun.

However the Minx bar offers a completely different scenario. The Minx Bar already attracts a large amount of young people drinking to excess and causing disturbances, and leaving broken classes and vomit around the local streets. I have walked past the Minx on a Friday night recently and a young girl was unconscious on the pavement and an ambulance had to be called.

I have friends who, for reasons I do not understand, allow their 17 year olds to regularly frequent the Minx bar and come home drunk on a Friday night. A large number of young people who frequent the Minx are unable to control their excessive drinking habits.

On a personal note I don't feel comfortable walking home from a nice meal out with friends and having to walk pass the Minx Bar. By extending the opening hours would increase the amount of drinking time and therefore the amount of crime and disorder in Loughton.

Loughton does not need a night club of this type which inevitable is what it will become if the hours are extended to 2am.

Please consider this application very seriously as I have grave concerns.





There are flats above the shops in the High Road, and residential properties on all the roads that "Minx" customers would have to use when leaving the premises in the early hours of the morning, on foot or in vehicles. There is therefore a considerable likelihood of disturbance, even if those concerned leave without undue noise – which is surely highly unlikely for groups after hours in a bar. Any rowdiness on the part of departing customers would of course have a much worse effect. Furthermore, what is acceptable up to say 11 pm may not be acceptable later in the night - this application would extend potential disturbance on a regular basis until after 2 am on Saturday and Sunday mornings. Even at between 10.30 and 11pm on a Saturday, after attending events at the Lopping Hall, my wife and I have experienced noisy crowds outside Minx, which we have found intimidating. The pavement has been blocked by these patrons, or would be patrons who, together with two large door staff refuse to move, forcing us to pass by in the road.

The nearby area has also been littered largely with promotional leaflets and, recently, with cigarette ends outside the rear courtyard, developed for smoking patrons. At present the mess seems to be largely cleared up first thing the following morning by street cleaning operatives (I would be interested to know who is paying for this - Minx or the following morning by street cleaning of the week

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there are two or three large commercial waste containers in the street at the side of the building, often open and obstructing the pavement, road, or both.

As indicated above, Loughton does not have a 'downtown' area distinct from residential streets; it is not the West End or Iford. It has a single main shopping street, which both comprises residential properties and is closely abutted by family residential streets. Minx is <u>immediately</u> <u>adjacent to such streets</u>. Its capacity is understood to be around 250 and numbers of that order discharging onto the streets late at night, let alone in the early hours, after a night in a drinks-based entertainment venue, are bound to be a public nuisance. The venue is basically incompatible with the location. To this must be added the cumulative effect of similar late-night venues in the immediate vicinity. The Nu bar, about two hundred yards away, and the Royal Oak, just up the family residential streets of High Beech Road, Smarts Lane, or Forest Road, offer similar late night attractions to Minx. Both have, perversely, been granted later hours in the face of strong and extensive objections by local residents, and Nu Bar advertises the serving of food until 3 am on its website. The combined effect must surely be to attract increased numbers of late night revellers into what is essentially a residential area, creating a late night bar circuit on residential streets with attendant public nuisance, vandalism, and low level criminality. Why should the residents of Loughton have to put up with this?



I am in receipt of such an application made by Mr Michael Stock the current Designated Premises Supervisor. The application on page 2 states that such a license was held for this activity in 2001. have searched our electronic data bases and hard copy files and can find no trace of such a license. have also checked with the licensing Authority and they are unable to find such a license being granted.

These premises have historically suffered its problems with a range of anti social activity with three major incidents in 2007. These are assaults, drunkenness, and criminal damage, to a window computer and car roof.

If the license for Nude dancing was pemitted, this activity would in all probability attract large numbers of young men and with a capacity for only 224 refused entry at the front door is likely to trigger disturbances or violent behaviour.

I have sought the advice of Senior Police Commanders and with comments I am about to raise Essex Police will be rigorously object to the grant of such a license.

Thus under the licensing objective of The Prevention of Crime and disorder Police object as there is likely to be an increase in crime and disorder. 





An application for such a consent, attached, has been received.



Further to our telephone conversation we are writing to raise our objection to the licence application made for a street trading consent at Cartersfield Road in Waltham Abbey.

We refer to the Council's Street Trading Policy, Section Aii which states "There are not shops selling similar goods or similar street traders within a reasonable proximity of the proposed trading location, taking account of the nature and character of the location and the trading hours applied for. It is unlikely that the Council would look favourably upon an application where there is similar provision within 1/4 mile of the proposed trading location".

We have traded at Brooker Road for over 20 years and believe that the siting of an additional snack bar would greatly reduce our livelihood as there is insufficient trade in the area to support 2 snack bars within such close proximity (within 1/4 of a mile).

We confirm my agreement to this objection being used.

Sir,

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I have looked at the attached application from Cheryl Tyndall of 6, Fountain Place, Waltham Abbey. She has requested to operate a fast food wagon in Cartersfield Rd from 8am to midnight, Monday to Saturday.

Cartersfield Rd is part of an industrial area of Waltham Abbey and as such the operating of such a wagon should not adversely effect local residents.

I do however have concerns regarding the proposed opening hours. The applicant proposes to stay open until midnight every day except Sunday. I believe that this would lead to an increase in people around the industrial units late at night when most businesses are closed. This may lead to the premises being vulnerable to increased crime.

There may also be an increase in foot traffic leaving the town centre pubs and trying to find late night food. They would most likely walk through Sewardstone street, along Brooker Road and into Cartersfield Road. This could lead to an increase in anti-social, drunken behaviour around these areas.

In summary, I cannot see any problem with the wagon operating during the day when local businesses would make use of it. If allowed to operate at night it could cause some problems.
