PART 3(2) - RESPONSIBILITY FOR COUNCIL FUNCTIONS

LICENSING COMMITTEE - TERMS OF REFERENCE

- (1) The full Committee shall comprise 11 Councillors appointed by the Council at its annual meeting, including a Chairman and Vice-Chairman.
- (2) For the functions set out in Annex 1, and the legislation listed in Annex 2, a Sub-Committee consisting of no more than any three Councillors drawn, in alphabetical order, from the members of the full Committee shall be formed. Any such Sub-Committee shall elect a Chairman on an ad-hoc basis.
- (3) For the transaction of business at full Committee meetings, the quorum shall be a minimum of five Committee members save that no business shall be transacted unless either the Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the Committee is present.
- (4) The Committee and Sub-Committees shall have full authority to hear and determine licensing applications.
- (5) The Committee and Sub-Committees shall be further empowered to determine appeals made against the decisions of the Head of Environmental Services taken under delegated authority on licensing applications.
- (6) The Committee shall at all times carry out its duties solely within the policy from time to time determined by the Council and shall conduct its proceedings in accordance with the requirements set out in Annex 3 (Conduct of Business by Licensing Committee and Sub-Committees).
- (7) The Licensing Committee shall take no part in the production or revision of the statement of licensing policy made under Section 5 of the Licensing Act 2003, however, they may determine policy under the legislation listed in Annex 3.

PART A – CONDUCT OF BUSINESS BY LICENSING COMMITTEE AND SUB-COMMITTEES

All references to committee in this annex shall be taken to infer a reference to the associated sub-committees.

1. General Conduct

- 1.1 All hearings of the Licensing Committee under the Licensing Act 2003, are to be held in accordance with the Personal Licences, Hearings, Premises Licences and Club Premises Certificates, and Licensing Register Regulations, made under the Licensing Act 2003.
- 1.2 The Council's Constitution shall regulate the conduct of and debate at meetings.
- 1.3 In the case of hearings under the Licensing Act 2003, the Committee shall only consider those matters relevant to the licensing objectives as set out in the Licensing Act 2003 and the statement of licensing policy adopted by the Council.

2. Declarations of Interest

2.1 Members of the Committee are subject to the Council's Code of Conduct and to advice from the Standard Board for England, details of which will be provided to those members.

3. Participation in the Hearing

- 3.1 Debate shall be restricted to members of the Licensing Committee. Where a local ward member, not being a member of the Committee, wishes to participate in the hearing, they may do so only with the permission of the Chairman and their participation shall be subject to the same rules as are applied to any other witnesses to the application.
- 3.2 In hearings other than those under the Licensing Act 2003, where a ward member is a member of the Committee, and wishes to object to the application, the member shall give 14 days' notice of their intention, and shall play no part in the decision-making process of the Committee. In hearings under the Licensing Act 2003, those named as responsible authorities and interested parties in the Act may only make representations within the time limits set out in the relevant statutory provisions.
- 3.3 All persons participating in the hearing shall be made aware of the limitations or scope of statements that will be acceptable and, in particular, that statements should be factual or a fair statement on a matter of public interest.

4. Attendance of the Public

4.1 The Council's Constitution and relevant statutory provisions relating to the admission or exclusion of the public shall apply to all meetings of the Licensing Committee.

5. Natural Justice

5.1 There are two elements to natural justice:

(a) Fairness

- (i) All persons affected by the decision or in the case of matters associated with the Licensing Act 2003, those named as responsible authorities and interested parties in the Act, will be allowed a hearing before a decision is made.
- (ii) Only objectors who can show clearly that they are affected by a decision shall be afforded the right to be heard or, in the case of hearings under the Licensing Act 2003, only those named in the Act as responsible authorities or interested parties.
- (iii) All information shall be made available, where possible in advance, to the applicant and the Committee.
- (iv) All members of the Committee shall be present throughout the hearing of a particular application. Where a member arrives late or leaves during a hearing of a particular application, that member shall play no part in the decision-making process. Where an application is adjourned it shall be continued by the same members only, and no others.
- (v) The Committee shall have discretion in respect of 'late' objections. Such objections shall be clearly marked on the agenda as such and the Committee shall decide on their acceptability. The applicant shall be advised of any late objections. In the case of representations made in relation to the Licensing Act 2003 applications, these shall only be accepted in accordance with the relevant statutory provisions.

(b) Prevention of Bias

- (i) The rules on the declarations of interest shall be firmly applied.
- (ii) If the Committee moves into private session to consider its decision, it shall be accompanied only by its advising officers, none of whom shall have taken a substantive part in the hearing, and shall play no substantive part in the decision-making process.

6. General Procedures for Hearings

- 6.1 The following procedural requirements shall be followed at all times:
 - (a) There shall be no recommendation from officers on the agenda;
 - (b) The Committee shall be supplied with copies of all relevant documentation and the process and order of procedure shall be as follows:
 - (i) The Chairman will open the meeting and introduce persons as appropriate asking applicants and representatives to identify themselves.
 - (ii) The Chairman will outline the procedure to be followed.

- (iii) The Lead Officer will outline the matter in hand.
- (iv) The applicant or representative will present his/her case, with or without witnesses, and be questioned by members or any objectors/persons making representations present.
- (v) Any objectors/persons making representations may then present their objections/representation, with or without witnesses, and be questioned by members or the applicant/s or their representative.
- (vi) The objectors/persons making representations may make a final statement (without introducing new issues).
- (vii) Finally, the applicant has the right to make a final statement (without introducing new issues).
- (viii) All evidence/disclosures are to be made in the presence of all persons, unless someone voluntarily excuses themselves from the proceedings.
- (ix) Committee members shall restrict themselves to questions and not discussion or comment.
- (x) The applicant, objectors/persons making representations shall be allowed to ask officers questions of a technical/factual nature at any time during the proceedings.
- (xi) An adjournment should be granted where to do otherwise would deny a fair hearing.
- (xii) The Committee may resolve to decide upon the application in private session, however, if it becomes necessary to recall anyone for additional information, everyone shall be invited to return to the Hearing.
- (xiii) The decision shall be given in the presence of all parties that wish to be present and confirmed in writing as soon as possible thereafter. If legal advice is given to members this advice will be repeated in summary form.







I have concerns that the proposed use in this area will lead to an increase in littering and antisocial behaviour/noise from customers attracted to the proposed use.

The proposed use is close to residential properties that are above the shops in Nazeingbury Parade. These noise sensitive premises are likely to be disturbed by any increase in noise due to customers either standing around the kebab van, or from customers' vehicles (music, engine noise) whilst waiting for food to be prepared, or eating food while parked at Nazeingbury Parade. I live at 20b Nazeingbury Parade and my flat is above the sandwich and fish & chip shop. I am writing to **OBJECT** to the street trading consent to sell kebab (takeaway) at the above location, for the following reasons:

- 1. Anti-social behaviour;
- 2. Noise;
- 3. Litter;
- 4. Car Park and Traffic Congestion,
- 5. Extensive Trading Hours;
- 6. Hygiene, and
- 7. Increase in Litter.

Encouraging Anti-social behaviour/Nuisance

I have lived here for 2 - 3 years at the above property and since I have phoned the police a few times regarding the youths hanging around the parade area in the later part of the evening. They tend to play loud music, shout and banging on the shutters of shops. However, they do tend to leave when all the shops in the parade are closed. The presence of a late night takeaway van will encourage them to congregate in the parade area later at night, which will prolong antisocial behaviour and nuisance in the parade.

Noise

The properties above the shops in the parade are residential units and the area itself is predominantly residential. I would like the Council to take note that two of the three bedrooms in my flat front onto Nazeingbury Parade, hence I am concerned with additional nuisance that the takeaway van may create, such as noise. The takeaway will attract additional cars (from customers) after 21:30 and noises as banging of car doors, revving of the engine and braking will be detrimental to our amenity.

From my understanding, the van will need to have their own supply of electricity to facilitate the takeaway, their electricity generator will often generate motoring noises, and this will add to the noise levels in the car park.

The takeaway will create additional noise in the night and this will have an adverse impact on our quality of life, coupled with the existing anti-social behaviour that we are currently experiencing.

Reduced Car Parking Spaces and Increased Traffic Congestion

Nazeingbury Parade's car park is there to serve the visitors who wish to use the shopping and service facilities there. As you are aware, the parade is well used by the local residents of Nazeing and is predominantly used by customers who travel by car.

There are a number of shops which are still open in the early evenings, such as:

Dry Cleaners – on selective days closes 6pm
Hairdressers – on selective days closes 8pm
Nail shop – from my understanding sometimes open later in the evening
Costcutter – Monday to Saturday closes at 9pm
Fish and chip – on two days they shut at 9:30pm, but generally shut at 9pm
Newsagent – on selective days closes at 8pm, but generally shut at 7pm

The shops detailed above are generally opened between 5pm and 7pm attracting a lot of customers, hence the car park is quite well used during these hours. From the information provided, the van is 2 metres wide and 4 metres long, hence I would assume that it would take up approximately 4 parking spaces in the car park, which will reduce the number of car parking spaces available to visitors. Sometimes customers already have to queue to get into the car park during the day and early evening, this often leads to a standstill of traffic at Nazeing Road.

Furthermore the takeaway van is proposing to be operational at 17:00pm, hence I am assuming they would need to be at the car park at least 15-30mins to prepare for opening. Please note that majority of the shops are still opened and the car park is still generally well used. In addition to the above shops, the post office/chemist is still open.

I have attached some photos with this letter which were taken on 16th July 2008 (Thursday) between 5pm and 6pm when I was able to do a brief monitoring session. Please note that I have not done a monitoring session for Friday, where the parade is likely to be busier.

Extensive Trading Hours

I consider that the trading hours are too late and furthermore it is proposing to open on Sundays from 5pm to 10:30pm, in addition to the late night opening during the weekdays. The additional nuisance such as anti-social behaviour, noise and traffic created by the late trading hours will be detrimental to my quality of life.

Hygiene

From my understanding, food premises are required to meet certain health and hygiene standards, will these standards be met?

Increase in Litter

A takeaway service generally create a lot of litter, as you maybe aware, there are only three litter bins along the parade and these are quite well already. Will there be additional refuse collection for these bins? Or additional litter bins, if there is where will it be located?

As a resident who lives above the shopping parade, I was not formally consulted upon by the Council in respect to this street trading application. Hence I have doubts as to whether other residents living above the parade have been consulted on this street trading application for a kebab takeaway.

I would be grateful if you confirm receipt of this letter, and advise me of the progress of this street trading application.





At a meeting of Nazeing Parish Council on 23rd July 2009, the application by Sadiye Bozkilrt for a license to trade from a mobile kebab van at Nazeingbury Parade, Nazeing was discussed.

This is a small parade of shops with residences above. The majority of the shops close at 6pm with the exception of a small fish & chip shop and corner grocery store that close at 9.30pm. The fish and chip shop is not open every day. There are other residential properties opposite the parade of shops and the whole area is predominantly residential.

The Parish Council object to the application for the following reasons:

The presence of the van could encourage local youngsters and youths in cars to congregate in the area. It could also encourage them from outside the area especially at the weekends after public houses have closed. There have previously been problems of anti-social behaviour in the vicinity of the shops.

There could be problems with odour, noise and rubbish created by the mobile kebab van. The parade of shops is close to an entrance to Lee Valley Regional Park which could encourage people to enter the park at night and dispose of rubbish.

Local residents and shopkeepers are strongly opposed to the application. It could affect their business and it is felt that it is not suitable for the area. Thank you for sending me the application for comment. I have also copied the local Parish Council who I am sure will also want to respond.

I would like to strongly object to this proposal on several grounds. Firstly the site for the van is a quiet local parade of shops which have residential dwelling above the shops. There are also houses to the side and opposite the parade of shops.

This set of shops serves the local community and most of them close by about 6pm with the exception of the corner grocery shop which closes at about 9:30pm and the small fish and chip shop which does not open every day but again always closes by 9:30pm. The proposed application is for seven days a week up to midnight which will cause noise disturbance, nuisance and smell to the residents. This would be totally unacceptable.

Secondly we have had problems in the past with anti social behaviour outside these shops with local youngsters and youths in cars congregating causing problems. I personally have called the police on several occasions. Following lots of work we have managed to control and reduce this. As a pharmacist working in the Elgon chemist in Nazeing aswell as being a local resident, i am writing to oppose the request for a kebab van to have a street trading license in the parade. I bring about the following points:


- 1. There are already two food outlets (fish 'n' chips and sandwich bar) in the parade who have been serving the local area for years.
- 2. The population in the local area is mainly affluent and middle-aged. The idea of eating out mainly revolves around eating in a restaurant and not getting takeaway. For those times when a takeaway is required, the local area is well served by outlets who provide a free delivery service to peoples' homes. These include Indian, chinese, pizza and kebabs.
- 3. The proposal would mean that at least 5 parking spaces would be taken up by the van. There are already times when there is a 'one out, one in' with respect to parking and losing spaces would just exacerbate the problem, not taking into account the persons getting in the way trying to get their 'order'.
- 4. There are the problems associated with having a late night kebab van. There is the issue of the rubbish and smell from the waste of paper bags, onions and meat. Whose responsibility will it be to maintain the level of cleanliness that we have on the parade.
- 5. Those who mainly desire a late night kebab will most likely be drunk. At the moment we in the parade only have some police presence in the form of a community officer spending a couple hours a week to speak to the public. With the increased possibility of urination and drunken damage, how will our properties be protected.
- 6. Businesswise there is no passing trade. There are no night clubs in the area, and the local pub is mainly visited by the older generation of the area.

I would also like to put an extra comment in that when the representative from the council came down to the parade they failed to come into the post office, the chemist or the beauty salon. We had to hear the proposal second-hand from other shop owners on the parade. We didn't even have a letter posted to us. Taking into account that the proposed site is down our end of the parade I find it deplorable and inexcusable. Elgon chemist has been in parade and been serving the community for over 25 years. I would like a reason on why the shops in question were missed out.
