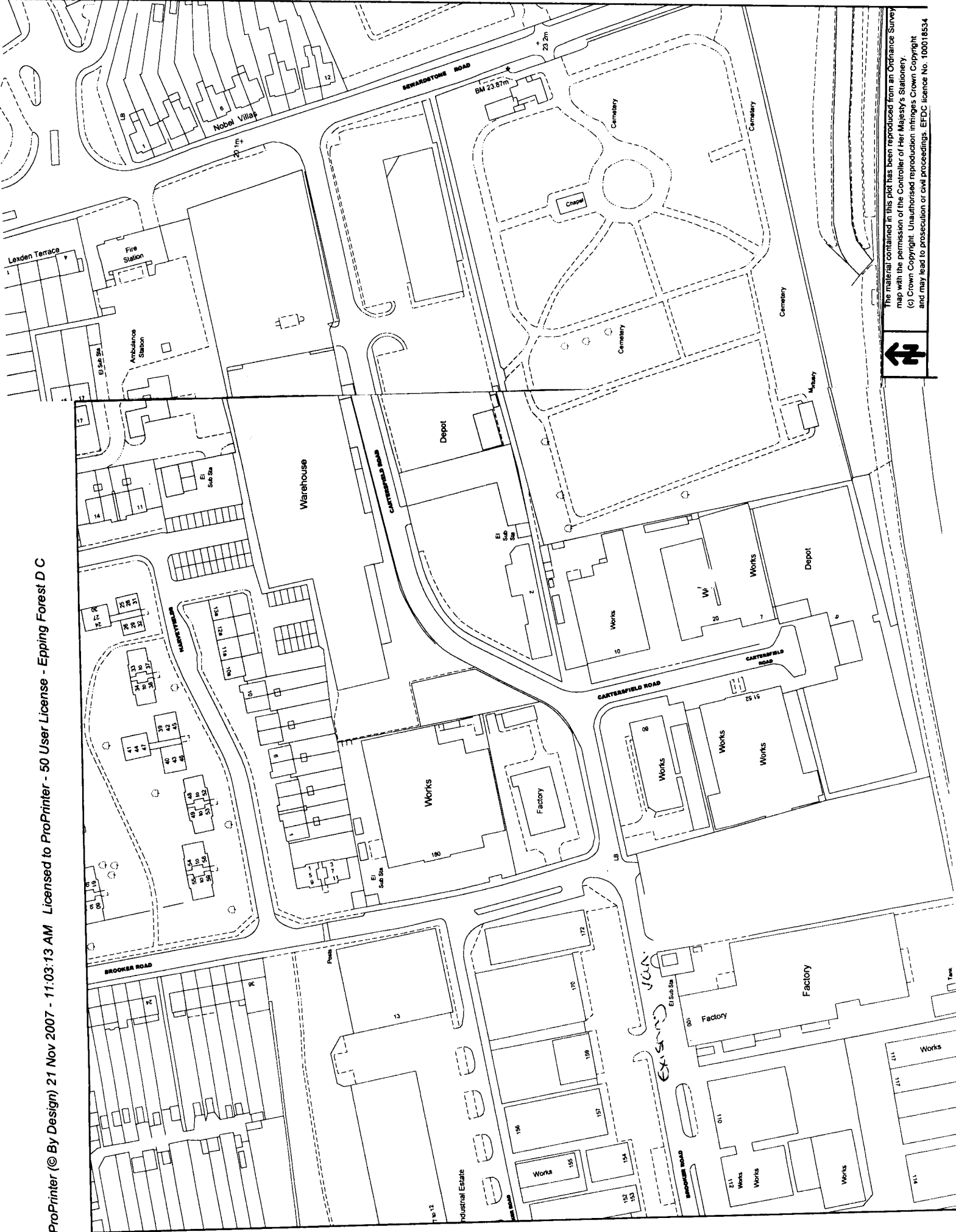

Further to our telephone conversation we are writing to raise our objection to the licence application made for a street trading consent at Cartersfield Road in Waltham Abbey.

We refer to the Council's Street Trading Policy, Section Aii which states "There are not shops selling similar goods or similar street traders within a reasonable proximity of the proposed trading location, taking account of the nature and character of the location and the trading hours applied for. It is unlikely that the Council would look favourably upon an application where there is similar provision within 1/4 mile of the proposed trading location".

We have traded at Brooker Road for over 20 years and believe that the siting of an additional snack bar would greatly reduce our livelihood as there is insufficient trade in the area to support 2 snack bars within such close proximity (within 1/4 of a mile).

We confirm my agreement to this objection being used.

**Re: Street trading application for Cartersfield Rd.**

Sir,

I have looked at the attached application from Cheryl Tyndall of 6, Fountain Place, Waltham Abbey. She has requested to operate a fast food wagon in Cartersfield Rd from 8am to midnight, Monday to Saturday.

Cartersfield Rd is part of an industrial area of Waltham Abbey and as such the operating of such a wagon should not adversely effect local residents.

I do however have concerns regarding the proposed opening hours. The applicant proposes to stay open until midnight every day except Sunday. I believe that this would lead to an increase in people around the industrial units late at night when most businesses are closed. This may lead to the premises being vulnerable to increased crime.

There may also be an increase in foot traffic leaving the town centre pubs and trying to find late night food. They would most likely walk through Sewardstone street, along Brooker Road and into Cartersfield Road. This could lead to an increase in anti-social, drunken behaviour around these areas.

In summary, I cannot see any problem with the wagon operating during the day when local businesses would make use of it. If allowed to operate at night it could cause some problems.
