a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 10)

Strong management controls and effective training of all staff so that they are aware of the premises licence and the requirements to meet the four licensing objectives with particular attention to;

- No selling alcohol to underage people
 - No drunk and disorderly behaviour on the premises
 - Vigilance in preventing the use and sale of illegal drugs at the premises
 - No violent and anti-social behaviour
 - No any harm to children
- Operating schedule providing the hours of operating and licensable activities during those hours
- Designated Premises Supervisor confirms and obligated to be in day-to-day control of the premises, to provide good training for staff on the Licensing Act (Training Record_ to make or authorize each sale.
- Clear "Challenge 25" Information to prevent the supply of alcohol to under-age drinkers
- CCTV system installed with recording

As a licensed premise we know that is necessary to carry out our functions or operate the business with purpose of promoting these objectives. We promise to support these objectives through operating, schedule and other measures including staff training and qualifications, policies, and strategic partnership with other agencies

No binge drink promotions will take place
Any person who appeared to be drunk and disorderly will not permitted to premises
Notices will placed prominent positions to ask patrons to leave quietly
Suitable evacuation plan in case of any emergency

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

CCTV System installed to monitor entrances, exits, and other parts of the premises in order to address the prevention of crime objective.

A clear and legible notice outside the premises indicating the normal hours under the terms of the premises licence during which licensable activities are permitted.

Clear and conspicuous notices warning of potential criminal activity, such as theft, that may target customers will be displayed.

Not selling of alcohol to drunk or intoxicated customers.

Custom will not be sought by means of personal solicitation outside or in the vicinity of the premises.

Prevention and vigilance in illegal drug use at the premises.

Staff will be well trained in asking customers to use premises in an orderly and

respectful manner and prevent drinking alcohol at the premises (ex. canned or bottled beer).

c) public safety

Internal and external lighting fixed to promote the public safety objective.
Well trained staff adherence to environmental health requirements.
Training and implementation of underage ID checks.

A log book or recording system shall be kept upon the premises in which shall be entered particulars of inspections made; those required to be made by statute, and information compiled to comply with any public safety condition attached to the premises licence that requires the recording of such information. The logbook shall be kept available for inspection when required by persons authorised by the Licensing Act 2003 or associated legislation.

All parts of the premises and all fittings and apparatus therein, door fastenings and notices, lighting, heating, electrical, air condition, sanitary accommodation, and other installations, will be maintained at all times in good order and in a safe condition

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Prominent clear and legible notices will be displayed at the exit requesting the public to respect the needs of nearby residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.

Deliveries of goods necessary for the operation of the business will be carried out at such a time or in such a manner as to prevent nuisance and disturbance to nearby residents.

The Licensee will ensure that staff who arrive early morning or depart late at night (ex. for unpacking, pricing newly delivered goods) when the business has ceased trading conduct themselves in such a manner to avoid causing disturbance to nearby residents.

Customers will be asked not to stand around loudly talking in the street outside the premises.

Customers will not be admitted to premises above opening hours.

The movement of bins and rubbish outside the premises will be kept to a minimum. This will help to reduce the levels of noise produced by the premises.

Any lighting on or outside the premises will be positioned and screened in such a way so as to not cause a disturbance to nearby residents.

Adequate waste receptacles for use by customers will be provided in the local vicinity.

c) The protection of children from harm

Challenge 25" sign which is a retailing strategy that encourages anyone who is over 18 but looks under 25 to carry acceptable ID (a card bearing the PASS hologram, a photographic driving license or a passport) if they wish to buy alcohol. Well trained staff about requirement for persons' identification, age establishment etc. All the details provided in Training Record Book available the retail unit. Logbook will be kept upon the premises all the time. Nothing belong existing Health & Safety requirements.

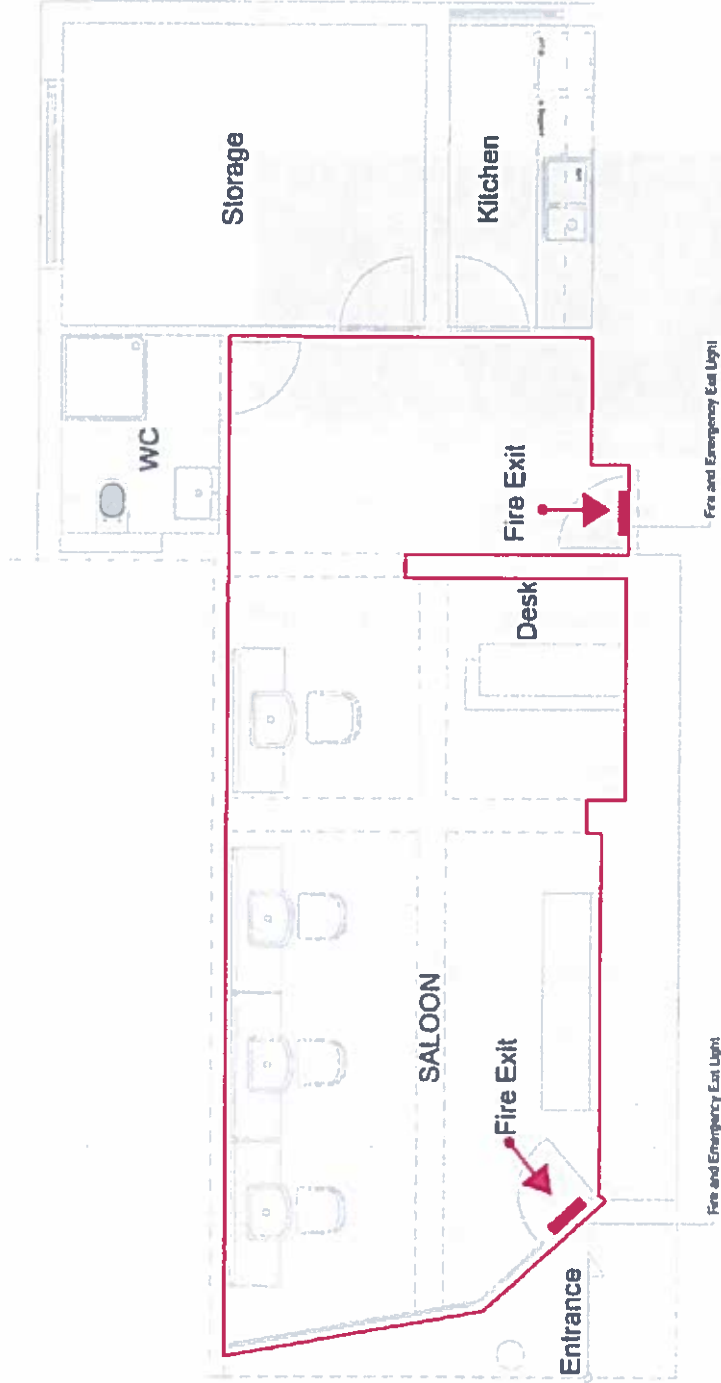

On behalf of the Parish Council

I wish to advise that the Parish Council discussed this application at considerable length and the following comments were made after which it was agreed that a **STRONG OBJECTION** to this application should be put in.

- 1 There is a strong possibility of selling alcohol to underage people which would encourage an increase in anti social behaviour
- 2 Harm to children and young people under 18
- 3 Could encourage drunk and disorderly behaviour both on and off the premises
- 4 Can not guarantee that alcohol would not be sold to customers who have already consumed alcohol elsewhere, so could already be intoxicated
- 5 Customers could ask others to purchase alcohol for them
- 6 There is already concern that drugs are being bought and sold illegally in the parish (police are aware) this could add to the problem.
- 7 People being intoxicated during the day time and driving their vehicles therefore increase to the public safety by Drink Driving
- 8 Lack of Parking and increase in Noise Levels thereby causing a public nuisance to local residents.

I will advise Members of your recent email advising that the Applicant has amended it to ON Premises Sales only and ask if they would like to make any amendments.

We write further to the Notification of Consultation received in respect to the Application by Enes Sanli at Arans Barber, 38 High Road, North Weald, Epping as we are direct neighbours to the premises.

We oppose this licence on based on the following grounds:

The prevention on crime and disorder

We already have several establishments in the Village selling alcohol and question why a barbers shop would want a licence to sell alcohol both on and OFF the premises from noon until 7pm every day of the week which has the potential to lead to it becoming a risk to attracting crime and disorder to this very residential area of the Village.

Public Safety

Yet another alcohol licensed premises poses a risk to public safety as it may lead to becoming a magnet for anti social behaviour and hanging around causing crowds to gather and intimidating behaviour to the residents.

The prevention of public nuisance



Good Afternoon Mr Sanli,

Following on from our phone conversation you advised me that you are a barber shop that wishes to supply customers who are having a hair cut with a beer. You do not wish for the off sales of alcohol, only the on sales.

Essex Police feel that these conditions should be added onto the licence:

- No alcohol may be supplied by an individual unless that individual has the written consent of the Designated Premises Supervisor or other employed Personal Licence Holder.
A written record of this consent must be retained on the premises at all times when such an individual supplies or proposes to supply alcohol and be made available immediately upon reasonable request of the police or licensing authority.
- CCTV
 - 1) CCTV Equipment must be maintained in good working order, be correctly time and date stamped, recordings must be kept in good working order and kept for a minimum period of 31 days.
 - 2) At all times, whilst the premises is open for licensable activities, there are members of staff able to immediately provide viewable copies of recordings to the police or licensing authority staff upon reasonable request.
- All staff engaged in the sale or supply of alcohol on the premises shall have received training in relation to the protection of children from harm (including under-age sales), how to recognise drunkenness and the duty not to serve drunk persons. Refresher training shall be carried out at least every six months.
Training records shall be kept on the premises (or otherwise be accessible on the premises) for a minimum of 12 months and made immediately available to police, trading standards or licensing authority staff upon reasonable request.

- A refusals record shall be maintained at the premises that details all refusals to sell alcohol. Each entry shall, as a minimum, record the date and time of the refusal and the name of the staff member refusing the sale.
All entries must be made as soon as possible and in any event within 4 hours of the refusal and the record must be made immediately available to police, trading standards or licensing authority staff upon reasonable request.
The refusals record shall be either electronic or maintained in a bound document and retained for at least 12 months from the date of the last entry.
- The premises must operate as a Barbers:
 - 1) Where alcohol must not be sold, supplied otherwise than to customers who are attending the barbers primarily for a haircut.
 - 2) Which do not provide any takeaway service of alcohol.
