Item 3. Climate Action introduction and feedback from schools

- i) Davenant Foundation school. Oscar reported that two school councillors are in discussion with the leader of the school garden, Mr Pickhaver, who has been looking into environmental improvements that the school can make, but to date this has not been actioned. In the school garden they have planted and started to grow crops to use in food tech lessons to reduce buying. Also planting fruit trees.
- **ii) Debden Park High school.** Daniel reported that the school rents their land and therefore there are many restrictions to what they can do. The school sub-contracts their food suppliers and have little control over the food supplied. There is also a lack of space to recycle waste.

iii) Epping St Johns School. Mr Ahmed from Epping St Johns is unable to attend tonight meeting as Epping St Johns have parents evening. Mr Ahmed has kindly sent Epping St John's Green action plan.

Programme	Action
The school now has Meat free Mondays	This is to encourage students to have a Meat free Monday to lower pupils and staff's meat consumption, which is important because meat and dairy consumption account for 14.5% of global greenhouse emissions.
Greening the curriculum	The school have been working hard to Embed the climate emergency in the curriculum, to raise awareness of the critical danger our planet is in. All subjects from Science to Art to English should teach pupils about the climate emergency.
Going Green	This is to Encourage students to be responsible for their planet by switching off lights in the classrooms, when not needed, recycling more and discouraging waste.

iv) New City College. Matthew Carter is the Eco & Sustainability representative on the student union. They are offering meat free Mondays, removing plastic bottles in the college shops and phasing out single use plastic. They are using sustainably sourced and locally produced foods. They are introducing aluminium cans to reduce plastic bottle consumption. They are also knocking down one of their campus and rebuilding it to make it more sustainable. This will include electric chargers in every carpark. Also implementing carbon literacy training for teachers and planting 100 trees in the district. They are also promoting the use of public transport.
