Since the sad death of the landlord (Brian Murphy) the pub has been run and managed successfully by Mr Mark Buckley. Since his time in running the pub it has continued to be well managed.

As a well run business, and continuing to be well run under Mr Buckley, it has proved to be a very positive asset for the people of Nazeing to to enjoy at their leisure.

As Nazeing has a population of circa. 5000 people and at a guess the pub enjoys a footfall of approximate 150 to 250 customers in any one week it seems unfair not to grant the requested licence.

I fully understand that certain residents have complained about primarily "loud music" but surely any licence issued by the council would be strict in the level of sound allowed and then policed to ensure that the contained restrictions would be followed.

The pub is a community asset for everyone who wishes to use it's offerings and the staff are reasonably long serving and very welcoming and efficient.

My point is that should the council issue a licence that would restrict the enterprise to be unsuccessful as a business the village would lose a community asset that would be difficult to replace.

I hope the license will be reinstated and the billet will continue to be a hub of the community.

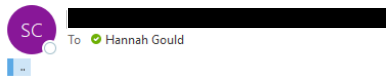

I am writing **in SUPPORT** of the premises licence application for The Crooked Billet Public House, Middle Street, Nazeing, EN9 2LD.

I am a local resident; I live [REDACTED] to the Pub and have done so for 34 (thirty-four) years. It is my "local" and I would say that I am a regular user of this pub.

One of the persons concerned with White Bear Tavern Limited is known to me, he is a friend, fellow golfer and also a regular at the Pub. He had helped Mr Murphy for a few years in his personal/professional life, leading up to Mr Murphy's death.

I know that White Bear Taverns run other pubs, namely the White Bear in Broxbourne and The Sultan in Waltham Abbey, neither of which (to my knowledge) have any issues. I need to point out that the White Bear like The Crooked Billet is very close, although not exclusively so, to residential properties.

Refusal of a licence for the Crooked Billet will promote **Crime and Disorder**. It is the only pub in Nazeing, which is one of the biggest villages in Essex. The closure would mean that residents, many of whom can easily walk to The Crooked Billet, would need to drive to other pubs. This increases the likelihood of Drinking and Driving offences being committed. It (refusal) could also generate disorder, as the younger generation who are now frequenting the pub, could resort to drinking in Public, by the shops or in the Country Park (Clayton Hill), without supervision, with the possibility of increasing the already considerable litter problems and drunkenness and the associated anti-social behaviour.

This pub is in the middle of a residential area and in the 34 years I have lived here, I have only been woken/disturbed by activities of the pub 3 or 4 times and for many of those years I was a Metropolitan Police Officer doing shift worker and retired as an Inspector.

The pub is a **safe place** to meet, over the years the fires/heaters have been changed and the lighting modernised. Anyone can walk into the pub and they will be treated properly and respected, a recent incident where a distraught lady came into the pub, resulted in her being assisted by the staff and regulars and eventually being taken home (by cab) and the police arresting her alleged assailant. It has to be safer for the general public for people to be drinking in a pub, rather than "wandering" the streets being intoxicated/unsteady. Most people have a raised sense of awareness, especially when driving, near Pubs during permitted hours. So having the pub open and functioning properly ensures/increases **public safety**. It should also be noted, that in properly run pubs, when clientele overstep the mark, the staff (and in some instances other patrons) will say they have had enough and suggest they go home. Indeed, the staff can refuse more service. This will NOT happen on the street or in public areas.

REFUSAL of a licence for the Crooked Billet could generate **Public Nuisance**. Less public/street drinking, as they will be in the pub, means that Less Litter will be generated. An open and properly run pub reduces the likelihood of Road Traffic Collisions, as I previously stated (Most people have a raised sense of awareness, especially when driving, near Pubs), that may not apply elsewhere, at the shops and at entrances/exits to the Country Park.

Some people may refer to the noise that was generated last year from the pub. I will state that it is a rare occurrence and was during the period where everyone, due to Covid compliance rules, had to be served in the garden and it was during the European Football Championships. In which England and Italy did well. Like most areas in the Lea Valley the pub has a good number of Italian nationals and descendants, this generated some of the well-mannered, although vocally loud, banter.

I will re-iterate that in the 34 years I have lived here, I have only been woken/disturbed by activities of the pub 3 or 4 times. Many of the nearby residents have NOT lived here that long. I believe that if you live near a pub, you should accept that on rare occasions some degree of celebrations/excitement will occur, an average of one every ten years is my mind acceptable and very good.

This country has strict laws around licensed premises and children which have to be adhered to by Licensee's and staff, in order to **protect children from Harm**. The Crooked Billet has a very pleasant small garden, that was used during "outdoor" covid rules. While having Children in the pub is not ideal, there is nothing better than having a family drink in a pub garden on a pleasant summer's evening. The closure of the Crooked Billet could increase the likelihood of Children being harmed, due to possibilities of Drink/driving or being left home alone.

I accept that the Pub is in a residential area that has a school, however very few Children actually walk past the premises on the way to/from school. Going home from School time, is not a popular drinking/socialising time as most people are still at work, and those that do use that pub at that time of day remain inside the pub and do not use the outside areas, so in that respect no harm can come to children.

In Conclusion, the Crooked Billet is now the only pub in the village and we want and need it to remain open. It is a focal point in the centre of the village, we do not have another meeting place near the denser population areas of Nazeing. It is used by all age groups and demographics.

The OAPS can and some do walk round from the Hyde Mead Elderly Persons Home, the pub historically supported a Christmas dinner for local OAPS. It is regularly visited by Golfers from the nearby course. The quiz evenings and the darts nights are proving popular and are well supported by a wide and diverse age range group.
