POLICE OBJECTION NOTICE To a Temporary Event Notice (TEN) Section 104 Licensing Act 2003

On 20th June 2023 Essex Police received the above Notice(s).

The Police are satisfied that the allowing the premises to be used in accordance with the notice(s) would undermine one or more of the licensing objectives.

The licensing objective(s) of relevance to this objection notice are:

- · Prevention of Crime and Disorder
- Prevention of Public Nuisance

The reasons for being so satisfied are that the premises already benefits from a Premises Licence until 02:00 (Fridays-Saturdays); this notice seeks to run from 20:00 to 03:45. Allowing the event to take place under a TEN would essentially allow the premises to operate outside of the conditions listed on the premises licence.

Currently by 02:30 (premises closes at 2am) any anti-social behaviour and violence is coming to an end. With this TEN ending at 03:45 these types of disturbances have the potential to occur over a longer period and at a much later time, disrupting residents and placing additional burden upon the police and ambulance services.



At 03:45 there will be fewer methods for customers to leave the area, as local taxi companies will have likely ceased trading. This increases the potential for crime and disorder as patrons congregate outside waiting for the few passing taxis and private hire vehicles available.

Furthermore, the premises is in close proximity to residential addresses and with up to 200 people (as stated by the applicant on the Temporary Event Notice but could be up to 499 people) leaving the premises at 03:45; is likely to create noise causing a public nuisance.

This premises has already had incidents of crime and disorder and noise nuisance over the past year related to people leaving the venue, further highlighting the concerns that Essex Police have.

A copy of this objection notice has been served upon the premises user (or agent making application), the local Environmental Health Department and the relevant licensing authority.

On receipt of this notice the licensing authority will issue a 'Counter Notice' and provide further information on related procedures.

Mandatory Conditions

All Premises Licence authorising supply of alcohol

The licence is granted subject to the Mandatory conditions for sale of alcohol as set out in the Licensing Act 2003 as amended by the Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2010 and Order 2014.

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the Premises Licence –

At a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence; or

At a time when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence or his Personal Licence is suspended.

- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the Premises Licence must be made, or authorised by a person who holds a Personal Licence.
- 3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises.
 - a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
 - e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

- 5. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
 - (a) a holographic mark or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures –
 - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

Minimum Drinks Pricing

- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

$$P = D + (DxV)$$

Where -

- (i)P is the permitted price
- (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence –

- (i) The holder of the premises licence
- (ii) The designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
- (iii) The personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from the paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

If the Premises Licence allows Exhibition of Films

- 1. Where a premises licence authorises the exhibition of films, the licence must include a condition requiring the admission of children to the exhibition of any film to be restricted in accordance with this section.
- 2. Where the film classification body is specified in the licence, unless subsection (3)(b) applies, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation by that body.

3.Where

- (a) The film classification body is not specified in the licence, or
- (b) The relevant licensing authority has notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question,

admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.

4.In this section "children" means any person aged under 18; and

"film classification body" means the person or persons designated as the authority under Section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984(c39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification).

If the Premises Licence has conditions in respect of Door Supervision

except theatres, cinemas, bingo halls and casinos

1. Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each such individual must:

- (a) be authorised to carry out that activity by a licence granted under the Private Security Industry Act 2001: or
- (b) be entitled to carry out that activity by virtue of section 4 of the Act.
- 2.But nothing in subsection (1) requires such a condition to be imposed:
- (a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films); or
- (b) in respect of premises in relation to:
- (i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
- (ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act.
- 3. For the purposes of this section:
- (a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and, which is licensable conduct for the purposes of that Act, (see Section 3(2) of that Act) and
- (b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule:

- Not more than 180 200 persons in total shall be permitted to be seated and 20 persons at the bar for the purposes of any entertainment permitted by this license.
- No Statutory nuisance shall be caused to local residents in the vicinity of the Abbey Restaurant & Bar.
- An appropriate noise automatic noise control device must be used for any amplified music. The device must be set to a level, which will prevent any amplified music emanating from the premises causing a nuisance to the occupiers of the noise sensitive premises.
- At the close of every licensable event, the management of the premises shall make an
 announcement quietly, so as not to cause disturbance to nearby residents. A sign shall
 be displayed within the premises requesting customers to leave quietly and staff shall
 also be required to leave the premises quietly to avoid slamming doors when entering
 their vehicles.

Annexe 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority:

Sub-Committee Hearing 28th April 2015

Prevention of Crime & Disorder

1. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system covering the internal and external of the premises. It will also cover all entry and exit points enabling full frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open to the public and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings will be kept in an unedited format for a period of not less the 28 days with time and date stamping. Recording shall be made available immediately upon lawful request of Police, Local Authority or Trading Standards. Download or export of CCTV should be in the native file format with the native player.

A staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system shall be available at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member must be able to show Police, Local Authority or Trading Standards recent data or footage with the absolute minimum of delay.

2. No entry or re-entry after 00:30 except for bona fide customers who have used the designated smoking areas & monitored by a designated member of staff.

Public Safety

- 1. The management will risk assess the need for SIA registered door staff. These risk assessments shall be kept for 12 months and be available for inspection immediately upon request of Essex Police or other Responsible Authority.
- 2. When a requirement for door staff has been identified by the management or Essex Police a minimum of 2 SIA registered door staff shall be employed.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

- 1. No drinkware permitted outside the premises. Including to the smoking terrace.
- 2. No more than 15 people are permitted to use the smoking terrace at any time.
- 3. No more than 15 people are permitted to the front of the premises at any time

The Protection of Children from Harm

- 1. The premises shall operate a Challenge 25 age verification policy. Any person who appears to be under the age of 25 shall be asked to produce photographic identification to prove they are 18 or over. Failure to produce, will result in service being refused. Acceptable forms of photographic identification include:
- i. Passport,
- ii. Photocard Driving Licence,
- iii. Photographic ID bearing the 'PASS' hologram.
 - Seating to be varied to 200 persons.
 - Bar to remain at 20 persons.
