Recommendation:

To consider the Council's response to the consultation on the operation of the Traffic Management Act 2004

1. Sections 85 and 86 of the Traffic Management Act 2004 (TMA) came into force on the 31st of March 2008. These sections prohibit parking:

- (a) at dropped footways; and
- (b) double parking

2. Although these powers are also available in the London Boroughs, they operate differently in that there is no requirement for there to be roadside signage or road markings indicating to drivers that these prohibitions are in place. Signage and markings are of course required for other parking restrictions. The Government is consulting on whether it should amend the TMA to enable authorities outside of London to also enforce these new restrictions without the need to erect signage.

3. Government takes the view that:

(a) drivers should already be aware, through the Highway Code, that they should not double park nor park across dropped kerbs which are there to assist those with mobility difficulties to cross the road or provide access into off street parking, for example, in front gardens;

(b) the TMA should be enforced consistently throughout the UK thereby avoiding drivers being unaware of different regimes; and

(c) the removal of the requirement to erect signs reduces street clutter providing a better environment and making the footways easier to clean etc.
