I wish to object to this is strongest possible way.

Since his previous licence was revoked there has been an increase in lorries parking in this section of the road presumably due to the avoidance of the parking charge in the lorry park on the opposite side of the road.


I frequently use this section of road during the evening and late evening and find it very dangerous with lorries parked on both sides of the road leaving very little space for passing motorists.

If this burger van was to reappear we would see a worsening of the parking problems with double parking (as there previously was when the burger van was there) and the virtual obstruction of Honey Lane.

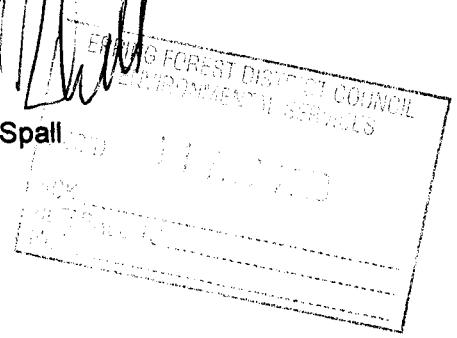

I would like to strongly object to the proposal for a mobile cafe overnight in Honey Lane, Waltham Abbey. It is extremely dangerous there and with the added incentive for more lorries to park and stay there it would create chaos for people trying to drive past. When the other mobile cafe was there lorries were causing problems by pulling out without considerations to road users. Sometimes they double parked whilst they were getting food causing hold-ups along that part of the road. This is the main road to link the M25 and with 2 roundabouts within view it causes problems in either direction. I use this part of Honey Lane frequently and have lived in Honey Lane for about 10 years and Waltham Abbey for nearly 20. I have to take particular care on this stretch due to the huge lorries that seem to use that area as a lorry park on both sides of the road, making it difficult to view the road. Even though there is a lorry park most choose to park on the road. I feel that there will be an accident along this stretch soon if this is given the go-ahead. More traffic restrictions should be in place as signs seem to be ignored anyway. Double yellow lines should be on one side to stop blockages and fines for lorries parking in the bus-stop areas.

It has come to my notice today that an application has been made for a licence to be granted for a hamburger van in Honey Lane, Waltham Abbey.

As I had made objection to the granting of this licence in the past, I feel that I should have been notified of this re-application.


My objection to the siting of the van in the bus lay-by is for safety reasons. Large numbers of lorries and vans and cars park to make use of the facilities provided by the van, causing serious traffic problems. The vehicles double-park on occasions, causing congestion and endangerment to other road-users. A lorry jack-knifed in front of me on one occasion – fortunately, it was a “near miss”. One’s vision is obscured and vehicles are frequently forced on to the wrong side of the road.

Since the van was previously moved, things have very much improved.

I have not seen any planning application in the local newspaper.

Would you please attach a copy of my letter to the agenda for the Licensing Committee on 5 August 2008, when I understand the case is due to be heard.
