Prevention of Crime & Disorder

CCTV covering the internal and external of the premises and alcohol storage area will be installed and maintained. All CCTV will be kept in an unedited format for a period not less than 28 days. The images are to be made available to Police, Local Authority or Trading Standards for inspection upon request.

No sales shall be made to anyone who appears to be intoxicated.

All alcohol to be stored securely and no customer shall have access to the premises or to where the alcohol is stored during delivery hours.

The premises where the alcohol is stored shall be alarmed.

Public Safety

Premises will be closed to the public from midnight each day.

Prevention of Public Nuisance

Deliveries to be made to residential addresses only.

Deliveries within the Epping Forest District only.

The Protection of Children from Harm

The premises will operate a Challenge 25 policy ensuring customers who appear to be under the age of 25 will be asked for identification before the alcohol is handed to the customer.

Any customer ordering via telephone or online shall be warned that if they look under 25 they will be required to provide identification upon delivery of the alcohol.

A bound book shall be maintained by each member of delivery staff which will double as a delivery book, showing name, address, amount & type of alcohol, but also act as a refusal book whereby the recipient must sign to say they have shown valid identification which must be specified. This will be made available to Trading Standards, Essex Police or the Licensing Authority upon request.

Valid identification must have their photograph and date of birth, and will be a Passport, Driving Licence or identification bearing the 'PASS' hologram.

Zara Express, 23 The Broadway, Loughton - Application to extend its licensing hours for the supply of alcohol

I write to express my strong opposition to this application on the following grounds:

- i. The current proprietor at this address has been selling alcohol on a regular basis to under-age drinkers - thereby causing considerable further anti-social behaviour in The Broadway and surrounding areas. I have been in this shop on a number of occasions when under-age drinkers have purchased alcohol, and none of them were asked for ID.
2. The extension of their opening hours from their current time (11 pm - Monday to Saturday and 10.30 pm on Sundays) to 12 midnight, is wholly inappropriate in this residential area.
3. Their application to make deliveries of alcohol between the hours of 12 midnight to 2 pm (and 3 pm on Fridays and Saturdays) appears a very strange request. How are these deliveries to be policed? Is there any way of knowing these deliveries of alcohol are to be made to adults or to under-18's?
4. In the immediate vicinity of my home, there are 11 children under the age of nine. The comings and goings of vehicles from Zara Express making these deliveries will be noisy and intrusive for these families.
5. I believe the extension of the licensing hours of this business will incur extra public nuisance.

The council's Planning & Licensing Committee considered this at the meeting on 20 February 2012, on behalf of residents at the following addresses:

The Committee OBJECTS to the variation sought and made the following response. If the Licensing Authority allows the public opening times to be extended daily to midnight, in addition to delivery until 02.00 Mondays to Thursdays and Sundays, with Fridays and Saturdays to 03.00, residents in the flats above will be constantly subjected to prolonged and increased noise. Members consider such an extension will only serve to encourage underage drinking, and they do not agree with facilitating the supply of alcohol to distant premises late at night.

The Committee therefore considers the proposal is contrary to the four main licensing objectives:

- the prevention of crime and disorder
- public safety
- the prevention of public nuisance
- the protection of children from harm

As the public speaker had stated at the meeting that the sale of alcohol to underage children was already a problem at the premises, the Town Council has reported this to Essex County Council Trading Standards and the speaker encouraged to do this as well.

I would be grateful if you could inform the Town Council which District Licensing Sub-Committee meeting will consider this application.

4. Where a premises licence authorises the exhibition of films, the admission of children to the exhibition of any film is to be restricted in accordance with section 20 Licensing Act 2003.

Conditions 5,6, 7 and 9 do not apply to premises licences where it authorises only the sale by retail off the premises.

5.—(1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—

- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;

(d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—

- (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
- (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;

(e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

6. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

7. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

8.—(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.

9. The responsible person shall ensure that—

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

- (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
- (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
- (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and

(b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

For the purposes of these conditions a responsible person is

- the holder of a premises licence in respect of the premises,
- the designated premises supervisor (if any) under such a licence, or
- (any individual aged 18 or over who is authorised for the purposes of this section by such a holder or supervisor,
