License Application – Minhe Lin, Weald Kitchen, 58 High Road North Weald

I wish to lodge my objection to the above application which seeks to expand the business of a Chinese take-away to one where alcohol can be sold. I list the reasons for my objection below.

1. The Co-op next door already sells alcohol relatively cheaply and daily until the evening and has applied for an extension to the hours during which it can be sold.
2. There are two pubs in North Weald where alcohol can be purchased under the control of the licensee to ensure reasonable consumption and acceptable behaviour.
3. There is also an off-licence in North Weald for the purchase of alcohol whose business will be seriously affected by this application.
4. The area outside the Chinese take-away is already used by groups of teenagers to gather in the evening and, perhaps unwittingly, intimidate residents - many of whom are from the several homes for the elderly in the village.
5. Attempts by retailers to expand the consumption of alcohol without the provision of facilities for its affects – drunkenness, litter, broken glass etc. will not help the community.
