Recommendations/Decisions Required:

To note the highway accident statistics provided by Essex Highways

Report:

1. Members of the Panel expressed a wish to receive highway accident statistics from Essex Highways. Members will also recall that when Nick Alston, the newly elected Police and Crime Commissioner for Essex addressed the panel at it last meeting, he also made reference to the perceived poor accident record in Essex and that he was intending to include this issue amongst his priorities for the forthcoming year.

2. Essex Highways operates on a pan-Essex basis, rather than prioritising one particular district. The priorities for Killed or Seriously Injured (KSI) in Essex are:

- (a) powered 2 wheeled;
- (b) young car drivers; and
- (c) pedestrians

which accounted for 29%, 18% and 15% respectively of the 630 KSI recorded in Essex in 2011. Approximately 30% of KSI comprise of issues such as mobile phone use, not wearing a seatbelt, speeding, driving too close to the vehicle in front and other similar poor driving behaviours.

- 3. In respect of this District, there were 83 KSI in 2011, comprised of:
- (a) 17 powered 2 wheeled (20%);
- (b) 10 young car drivers (12%); and
- (c) 15 pedestrians (18%)

Road Safety Engineers noted particular issues relating to the A121 through Loughton which have been investigated and treated where possible.

4. In order to address poor driving habits, Essex Highways has funded additional Police activity whereby areas are "surrounded" for a day and poor driving behaviours targeted. Some of this activity has, or is intended, to take place in the Loughton area.

5. Officers have asked Essex Highways for a more detailed breakdown of local accident statistics, with an indication of trends since 2011. If this becomes available it will be presented at the meeting
