All staff engaged in the sale of alcohol will be trained in respect of their legal and social responsibilities whilst doing so. They will also be trained in the contents of the premises licence including any conditions contained therein.

A record of all staff training provided shall be maintained by the premises licence holder, and shall be produced for inspection by the police or authorised officers of the licensing authority upon request.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Alcohol shall only be sold to persons who are dining at the restaurant.

No alcohol shall be taken from the premises in open containers.

Off sales of alcohol will be restricted to persons who have been customers of the restaurant only. Any alcohol taken from the premises shall be taken in sealed containers only.

c) Public safety

Staff shall be trained in respect of the fire risk assessment, and the health and safety risk assessment.

First aid facilities shall be provided at the premises.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Customers who wish to smoke will do so at the area in front of the premises. A notice shall be displayed requesting persons using this area to use it quietly, respecting the needs of the local community.

A notice shall be displayed requesting customers who are leaving the premises to do so quietly, respecting the needs of the local community.

There will be no deliveries to the premises other than between 0700hrs and 1800hrs on any given day.

No empty glassware shall be disposed of between 2200hrs and 0700hrs on any given day.

e) The protection of children from harm

The premises shall operate 'Challenge 25' as its age verification policy and staff shall be trained in respect of this policy.

The only forms of acceptable identification shall be a photo style driving licence, a passport, an ID card bearing the PASS logo in a hologram format, military ID and official European ID cards.

A notice shall be displayed at the premises to advise customers that Challenge 25 is in operation.

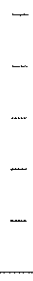

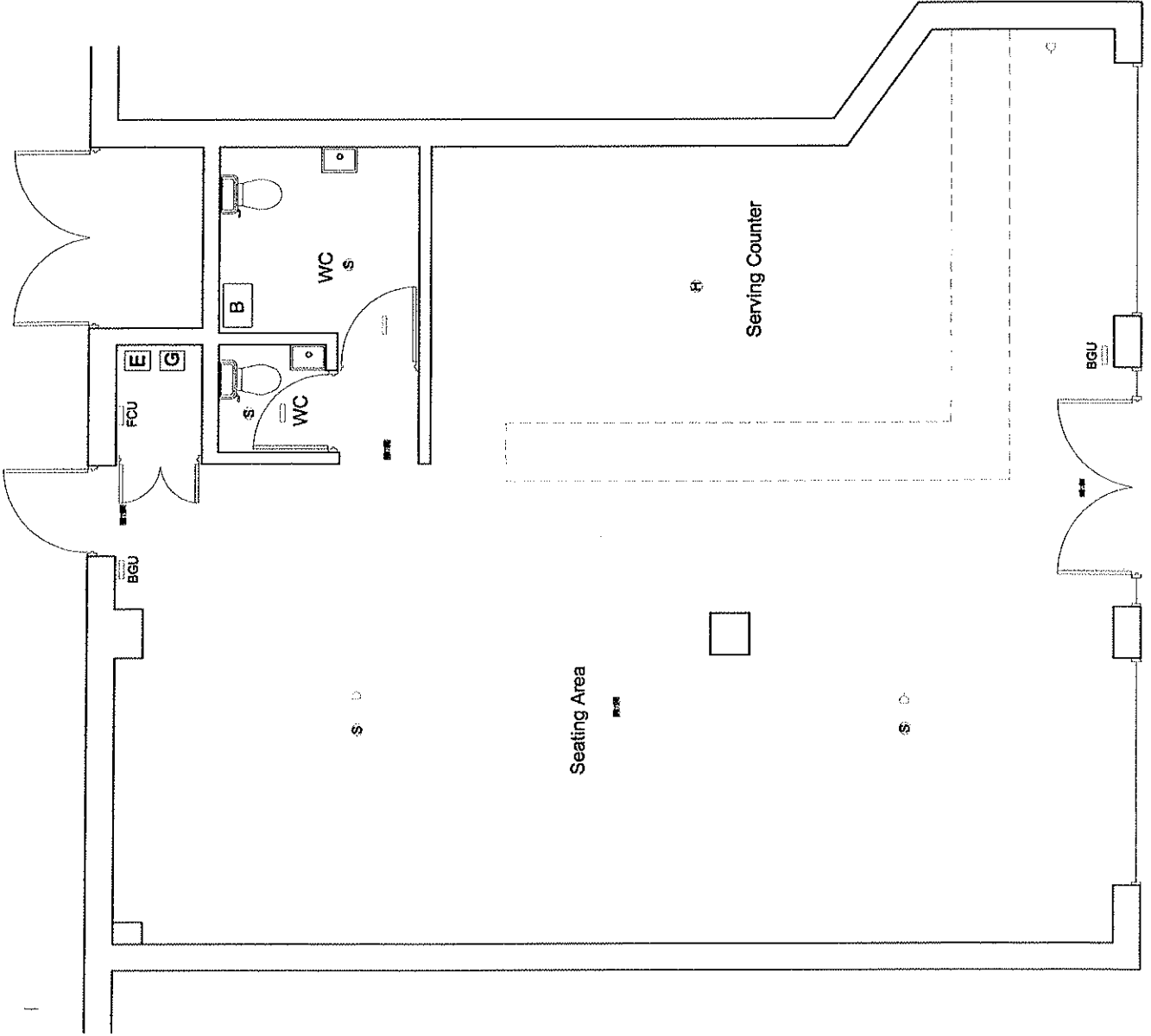

I am writing with regard to the new premises application made by Medmix Limited for Mezesphere 112-120 High Road, Loughton, Essex IG10 4HJ.

I wish to make representation on the grounds of **the prevention of public nuisance**. I am already disturbed every weekend by noise from people coming from Luxe and Nu bar. These people shout, scream and swear along the street just outside my flat. They also drive cars and motorbikes loudly and dangerously frequently sounding their horns. I feel this behaviour is likely to be due to a large intake of alcohol and fear that another establishment serving alcohol could only worsen this problem.

I can just about cope with being kept awake at the weekends, but this proposal is for a licence all week until midnight – this is much too late for a week night. This is a residential area and the situation is bad enough that I would move if I could afford it.

I would also like to make representation on the grounds of **the prevention of crime and disorder**. A few weeks ago someone was attacked with broken glass right outside my flat. I have also heard fights breaking out also likely to be fuelled by alcohol.

I have contacted the council on a number of occasions about the current problem, but it has not improved, I fear that if the problem worsens with another licensed premises I would continue to find complaining ineffectual.

We would like to record our strongest possible objection to the granting of the above licences for the following reasons:-

- The High Road has become a late night venue where mobs of people are discharged from premises late at night and all of whom are inebriated to a different degree. Some are drunk and disorderly. To have another late night drinking venue so close to existing late night licences and particularly opposite the Nu Bar is likely to add further to the violence that has occurred in the past. To prevent further crime and disorder the licences if granted at all should terminate at 11 pm.
- The High Road late at night has become a threatening place to young and old as people who frequent these places spill out onto the street and pedestrians have to walk in the road to avoid drunken louts. From a public safety viewpoint we believe that the licences should not be granted.
- We reside just around the corner to the site for which the licence is sought and Ollards Grove although it used to be a quiet residential street it is no longer the case. Frequently drunken hoards of youths having parked their cars in our road and then return to their cars after 12 pm and sometimes much later, singing, shouting, playing loud music, screeching car tyres and even hooting. Our grandchildren who stay at our house are frequently woken as we are ourselves. It is not fair on the residents in Ollards Grove to impose further damage to our living environment by the creation of even more public nuisance.
- I should also point out that these youths also throw litter, cans and empty wine bottles into residents' front gardens and bushes and into the road where smashed glass is a danger to motorists and pedestrians alike.

For all of the above reasons we would ask that the licences be refused but if the restaurant is to be a restaurant and not just another place selling alcohol and you were of a mind to licence the premises then that licence should terminate at 10 pm on all weekday nights with the sole exception on Saturday when it should be 11 pm.

I wish to make the following representations in respect of the above licence application on the grounds of the prevention of public nuisance.

I am the occupier of [REDACTED] Station Road, Loughton, which is in close proximity to 112-120 High Road (the "Premises"). At present, there are a number of premises licensed for the sale of alcohol, late night refreshment and late night entertainment concentrated around the location of the applicant's Premises. This concentration of licensed premises creates a significant amount of street noise as the evening progresses, as customers migrate from premises to premises or leaving for home, often in a loud and drunken manner, creating a significant amount of noise nuisance, especially around closing time.

During the summer months in particular, when the only means of ventilating bedrooms to a sufficient degree to maintain comfort is to leave windows open, the street noise created by this concentration of licensed premises is a significant disturbance and often interferes with my and my family's sleep. Even with windows closed, the street noise can be significant and still audible.

In addition, significant noise is created by the staff of various licensed premises as they clear glass bottles into recycling bins outside the premises, creating loud sounds of breaking glass, often after midnight, which is particularly disturbing.

The addition of another licensed premises to this location will exacerbate the current situation of unacceptable and nuisance noise levels late at night and consequently I object to the licensing of the applicants Premises for the sale of alcohol and / or late night refreshment.

The proposal that the applicant's Premises be licensed to serve alcohol until midnight is inappropriate in a mixed commercial / residential setting as this is more likely to cause noise during typical hours of sleep and therefore more usual licensing hours should be preserved, i.e. no later than 11pm, if any licence is granted at all.

My partner and I have been a resident of Loughton since 2010. I would like to raise a few issues which have affected me due to the high level of alcohol consumption in the High Road. My partner has been harassed by intoxicated people on a number of occasions whilst walking home from work, and on two occasions they have physically abused her.

It has come to my attention that another food premises is opening at: 112-120 High Road, Loughton, Essex, IG10 4HJ. For the safety of the general public, I would like to object to the sale of alcohol at the premises, so that people of Loughton do not have to go through traumatic experiences which individuals like as my partner has had to go through. Also in the last three years there have been devastating incidents which I have witnessed in Loughton including stabbings, sexual assault and even murders.

Also with the current supply of alcohol in Loughton via the current licensed premises in the High Road has also increased driving whilst intoxicated with alcohol, thus endangering the general public both in vehicles and on foot, also allowing the chance of further damage to buildings, and possibly leading to deaths.

Currently there are six premises who are serving alcohol around the premises which is in application, all of who are serving alcohol till late. These premises include Nu Bar, Loughton BBQ, Luxe Bar and Bayliss News (the off license). Therefore I do not think it is necessary to add to the list as it will increase the consumption within the area, and therefore cause more alcohol fuelled rage and bring more fights decreasing the safety of the public.

We are writing to object to this licensing application for the sale of alcohol after 10.30pm, and specifically object to **any** off-sales being permitted.

These premises are in close proximity to private housing; there are flats in the Loughton High Road, flats and houses in Ollards Grove, Connaught Avenue, Connaught Hill, High Beech Road and Smarts Lane. We are already experiencing noise nuisance late at night when trying to sleep, particularly when customers leave nearby Nu-Bar and Luxe bar late at night, shouting and yelling. This is a great public nuisance. Youngsters gravitate to this area in Loughton from all of North and East London, knowing that there are drugs and alcohol available until the early hours and there is seldom any Police presence. The area is becoming a no-go zone to local residents late at night. Everyone knows that Police are rarely around. We have used telephone numbers to call to report the nuisance, but there is often no-one available to attend the scene.

More late-night licensed premises (particularly if off-sales were allowed) would undoubtedly exacerbate the noise problem and increase the incidence of crime and disorder with neighbouring cars being damaged and residents' gardens vandalised and urinated in etc. Broken glass, bottles and vomit are often found in the adjoining streets; a safety issue to children and adults alike going to school/work/station in the morning.

Public safety is also threatened as this corner of Loughton is on the pedestrian route from Loughton Station and people are intimidated when trying to walk home past crowds of hyped-up, drunk/drugged and disorderly people hanging around on the street. The Police and Council should actually attend this area between 11.00pm - 1.00am at the weekend so that they can see for themselves and gain first-hand knowledge.

We hope these comments will be taken into account when deciding upon the application.
