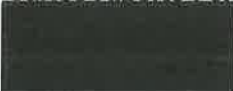

### **Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions:**

The licence is granted subject to the Mandatory conditions for sale of alcohol as set out in the Licensing Act 2003 as amended by the Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2010 and Order 2014.

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the Premises Licence –
  - (a) At a time when there is no Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of the Premises Licence; or
  - (b) At a time when the Designated Premises Supervisor does not hold a Personal Licence or his Personal Licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the Premises Licence must be made, or authorised by a person who holds a Personal Licence.
3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.  
(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises.
  - a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to –
    - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
    - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
  - b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

- e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 5.(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
  - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
  - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
    - (a) a holographic mark or
    - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 6. The responsible person shall ensure that –
  - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures –
    - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
    - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
    - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml; and
  - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
  - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

### **Minimum Drinks Pricing**

- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1 –
  - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
  - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula –
 
$$P = D + (D \times V)$$
 Where –
    - (i) P is the permitted price
    - (ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
    - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
  - (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence –
    - (i) The holder of the premises licence
    - (ii) The designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
    - (iii) The personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
  - (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from the paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.  
(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

If the Premises Licence has conditions in respect of Door Supervision except theatres, cinemas, bingo halls and casinos

1. Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, each such individual must:

- (a) be authorised to carry out that activity by a licence granted under the Private Security Industry Act 2001; or
- (b) be entitled to carry out that activity by virtue of section 4 of the Act.

2. But nothing in subsection (1) requires such a condition to be imposed:

(a) in respect of premises within paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films); or

(b) i in respect of premises in relation to:

- (i) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(3)(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), or
- (ii) any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).

3. For the purposes of this section:

- (a) "security activity" means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and, which is licensable conduct for the purposes of that Act, (see Section 3(2) of that Act) and
- (b) paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

### **The Prevention of Crime and Disorder.**

Staff will be given training to detect unruly behaviour at the earliest moment.

### **Public Safety**

First Aid kit will be available and a designated first aider will be on duty at all times

The premises will adhere to full fire regulations

**Prevention of Public nuisance**

Consumption of food and drink to be inside the premises only.

Signage will be displayed requesting customers to be aware of the public when entering and leaving premises

**The Protection of children from harm**

Children must be accompanied by a responsible adult.

No person who appears to be under the age of 21 will be permitted to purchase or consume alcohol on the premises without providing an approved proof of age identification which shows their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark; such as passport, photo driving licence or pass accredited card.

Notice is hereby given that the Essex County Council intends, not less than seven days from the date of this notice, to make the above Order under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. Effect of the order: To temporarily introduce 'No Waiting Monday - Friday 7.30am - 6.00pm' restrictions on St John's Road, Loughton in the District of Epping Forest as specified below.

**Road Description**  
 St John's Road, From a point 17 metres west of its junction with Loughton - North Church Hill westwards for 23 metres side

**St John's Road,** From a point 17 metres west of its junction with above-mentioned Order under sections 6, 124 and part IV of Schedule 8 of the Act 1984 (The Act) and of all other enabling powers. The effect of the Order will be to introduce Waiting Restrictions as specified in the Schedule to this notice.



We are tenants at [REDACTED] Brook Mews and live on two floors, our lounge is overlooking Brook Parade as is our bedroom on the floor above it.

Our concerns over the possibility of a late licence being given to this business would be the noise and disturbance associated with it.

Currently there are no other late night establishments along Brook Parade and so this would be out of character with the current area.

Each business along Brook Parade has a private flat above it and during summer months it is obviously necessary to live and sleep with the windows open. This is my representation regarding the abovementioned licence application.

I would request that my name and address be withheld from the applicants as I feel it is unnecessary to supply this information to them, especially in the event that their application is denied. I live very close to this Restaurant and therefore this request affects me and others living within a similar proximity.

I would also like to advise that I work in the hospitality industry and hold a Personal Licence, therefore I understand the need to adapt a business in order to maximise revenue, however, this must be considered in conjunction with the surrounding neighbourhood and as a result I am against this application being granted for the following reasons;

**Prevention of Crime and Disorder.**

- 1) The sale of alcohol until 1am will lead to disorderly behaviour until the early hours. Whilst I appreciate that the applicants will advise that they will control the sale of alcohol to individuals and will be serving it in conjunction with food, this is still a long period of time whereby alcohol will be consumed. They cannot and are not responsible for customers upon their departure and this is where the issues will occur until 1.30am/2am in the morning in the local area.
- 2) Customers use the King William IV pub to park in and consume alcohol before arriving at Papillon, as the Restaurant has no bar. Therefore their alcohol intake has already begun and the customer base of the two premises are connected. This can be seen quite clearly with customers crossing the road from one to the other.
- 3) If Papillon is granted this late alcohol licence are they then going to accept customers from the King William IV pub at midnight so that they can continue drinking until 1.30am? This will lead to issues spreading between the two properties and beyond.
- 4) There are already a number of police call outs to the King William IV pub and with late departing customers from the Papillon issues in the locality will increase. Proof of this can clearly be obtained via obvious records.

Prevention of Public Nuisance.

- a) Serving alcohol until 1.30am and closing thereafter will lead to disturbance until 1.30am/2am in the morning which is totally unacceptable for those living in the locality.
- b) Whilst I appreciate that it is a Friday and Saturday night, not all of the local neighbourhood wish to be kept awake until 2am/2.30am in the morning with people departing. It takes at least 1/2 hour for people to disburse after closing which can be proved with the King William IV pub and this includes; people shouting to each other whilst getting in their cars, car doors slamming and the frequent, typical revving up of fast cars to impress friends. Whilst I appreciate this may not be done with malice and may be down to a great night out, the fact remains that granting a late licence such as this, with the subsequent effects it will have, is unacceptable and will cause a public nuisance. It is not only the licence request that should be considered, it is also the related issues of departure that will cause the biggest problems at an unacceptable time of the morning.
- c) Does the Epping Forest District Council Out of Hours Noise department now have a member the team in the local area so that noise complaints can be handled effectively and "at the time" i.e.; 2am/2.30am?
- d) Being unable to sleep after after 2am/2.30am is unacceptable.

Public Safety

- 1) The current road traffic signs or lack of them on the Brook Parade causes issues with people driving up the Brook Parade the wrong way at speed. There is therefore great concern over the safety of those leaving that an accident is likely as the later the time the more often this can be seen.
- 2) Do the Police have the resources to Police the Brook Parade and Chigwell High Street if this licence variation is granted until 2am in the morning, thus ensuring the public safety of the local area?

Once again I do understand the requirement for maximising revenue in an establishment such as this, however, I am against this application due to the disturbance to the neighbourhood for all the reasons stated and I feel this application is unnecessary to the success of Papillon.

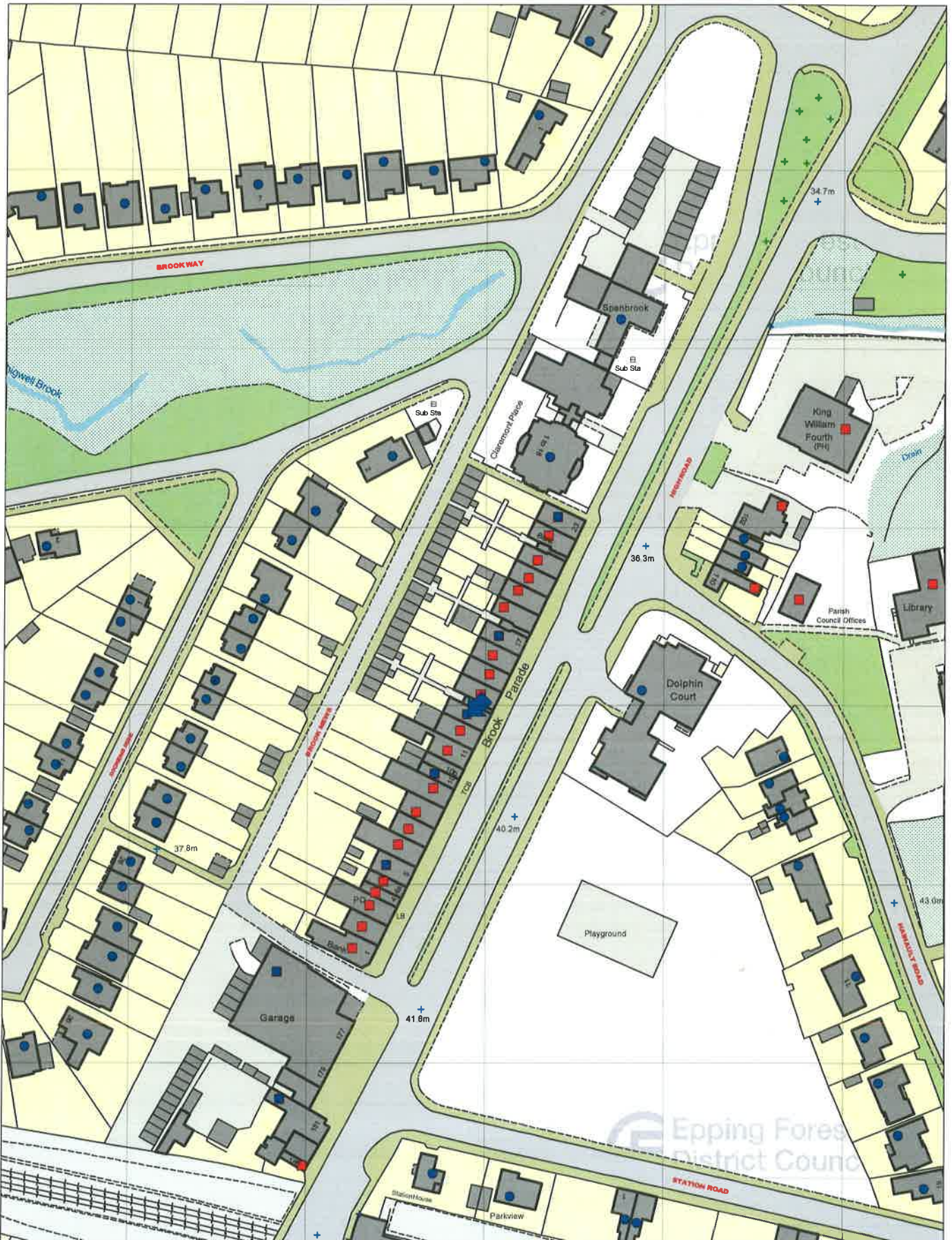
