





RE: COPPED HALL LICENSE APPLICATION

Dear Elizabeth,

As requested, please find enclosed objections to the license application for Copped Hall.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

Copped Hall is an ancient hunting park and rural estate dating from the 12th century or earlier and has long standing associations with Waltham Abbey. It is one of the most important historic sites in the district. The Hall, its outbuildings and parkland are a major feature of the Epping and Waltham Abbey area. The estate was designated a Conservation Area in 1984. The site are all Grade II listed buildings and the Gate Lodges on Crown Hill (the only vehicular access point to the Hall) are Grade II* listed buildings.

Epping Forest Council has produced a Conservation Strategy aimed at "ensuring the preservation of the unique heritage value of Copped Hall". The location of Copped Hall is within the Green Belt and its "special historic, architectural and heritage importance are the over-riding policy considerations relating to the future use of the site".

The Corporation of London and Conservators have imposed a Covenant on the Copped Hall Trust which states that access has to be by written approval only. The Superintendent of Epping Forest states in a letter to Epping Council Head of Planning and Technical Services Ref: P8xx0042 on 17th January 1995 that "Vehicular access to the site is unsuitable over the unmade track" to Copped Hall via the Gate Lodges off Crown Hill.

The increasing vehicular access and egress to Copped Hall with the expanding activities of the Trust is detrimental to the character of the area, is an inappropriate development in the Green Belt, detracts from the openness and rural character of the land that is designated a conservation area and is contrary to Polices GB2, HC6 and HC7 of the Council's Local Plan as well as the National Planning Policy.

PUBLIC SAFETY, PUBLIC NUISANCE & PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER

The evidence within the enclosed email correspondence between the Copped Hall Trustees, the Corporation of London and Adrian Hutchins dated 20/6/05, 17/7/05, 30/8/05, 14/9/05, 16/10/05, 20/3/06 and 18/6/06 shows an increasing threat to public safety and public nuisance. The enclosed photographic evidence shows examples of the traffic problems caused by events held at Copped Hall and vandalism to the Gate Lodge front door. The photograph also shows the main footpath access point to Copped Hall passes within 10 feet of the front door/living room to the West Gate Lodge, which causes problems as pedestrian and vehicular traffic increases year on year, as the Trust expands its commercial activities.

Emergency Vehicle access to Copped Hall is severely restricted. The sole driveway to the Hall is wide enough for only one vehicle to pass safely. The driveway also has to cross a very narrow bridge over the M25 motorway which not only restricts emergency vehicle access but forces pedestrian traffic into a dangerous confrontation and situation. The weight limit exceeded by the events held at Copped Hall, is a safety issue that the Highways Department will be investigating.

Please refer further to the enclosed email correspondence for a more detailed view on the Public Safety and Public Nuisance issues.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

A Copped Hall estate development, Planning Application EPF/1242/97, was refused planning permission on 2/12/1997, for the following reasons: 1. "The proposed conversion if approved would result in increased activity, traffic and general disturbance to the detriment of the visual and rural character of this Conservation Area. 2. "The provision of vehicular access to the site would result in failing to either preserve or enhance the character or appearance of the Conservation Area."

CONCLUSION

The Copped Hall Trust should not be permitted a permanent premises license. It is reasonable that they should continue to apply on an individual basis for each proposed event, to prevent the over-development and commercialisation within the Green Belt and designated Conservation Area. If the Trust are granted a permanent licence and are allowed to proceed unchecked then Epping Forest, Waltham Abbey and the surrounding areas are at risk of losing an unique, quiet and rural historical heritage site.

Thank you for considering our concerns and we look forward to the Panel's decision.

To the Trustees and Committee members of The Copped Hall Trust,

On Wednesday 15th June 2005 at 9:45 pm, I heard the arrival of three huge articulated lorries. The Copped Hall Trust (the Trust) had nobody posted on the gates to give them access, so the drivers tried to gain entry by pushing the gates and asking the Gatehouse owners to let them through. My parents, who live in the East Lodge, were both extremely frightened and disturbed by this; my family were also upset, as both my children were woken up and scared by the loud noises. This was reported to Alan Cox by myself with a telephone call at approximately 10 pm; from then on I did not receive any further communication from Alan Cox or anyone from the Trust.

The disturbances continued throughout the night until 4 am and then started again at 6:30 am. The extreme noise kept all the residents of Gatehouses awake the entire night. Then on Friday 17th June, 250 film extras and film crew came through the gates at approximately 5.30 am causing even more traffic noise, dust and pollution. Also, earlier in the week, a willow tree was damaged, leaving a branch dangerously hanging over my wife's car, which could have injured her or my children. The branch was seen by Trust members but just ignored and it was left up to the Gatehouse owners to arrange with the Corporation of London to prune and make the willow tree safe (the tree continued to be damaged throughout the week by more lorries leaving branches scattered on the road - again cleared up by the Gatehouse owners). This is just a brief outline of the extreme nature of the problems we encountered, which we intend to communicate with the Trust further.

I write this e-mail on Monday 20th June 2005, a full five days after initially telephoning Alan Cox and I have been forced to make the first contact with a representative of the Trust myself. My family and I have had no contact or apology from anyone with the Trust. The disturbances started on Monday 13th June 2005 and heavy traffic is still coming through the Gatehouses today. We were given no prior warning by the Trust at all, the little notice we did receive came via a third party location manager rather than the Trust itself. This gave us no time to object or even to prepare ourselves for the coming disturbances. The Trust must have had plenty of notice and therefore time to forewarn all the Copped Hall residents properly. This is clearly unacceptable. Especially as alternative road access to Copped Hall can and was made available by Mr Padfield and Mr Fletcher, via the northern gate.

I am in consultation with all the residents of Copped Hall and we will collectively contact the Trust again.

Saturday 17:15 16th July 2005 - People have been knocking on my door trying to exit Copped Hall after a history meeting. They were pulling and pushing the gates trying to get them to open. They eventually knocked on my door and asked me to open the gates for them.

After all the assurances by the Trust, we are being disturbed again. It is unreasonable and unfair to expect us to live with the continuous disturbances, that the Trust, are ultimately responsible for.

We have been here many times before. The residents get disturbed, the Trust apologises and promises changes. We get disturbed again, the Trust gives more promises, etc etc. It just goes on and on. Again today, people knocking on my door. I am at my wits end, upset and totally stressed out. I did not choose to live here to become ill. When we bought our house it was in an extremely quiet and peaceful environment. The Copped Hall Trust have made this no longer the case by creating the sheer volume of motor vehicles that now drive up the track to Copped Hall. The escalation of traffic visiting Copped Hall over the past few years has become a crisis.

Unforntunately, the gate owners were unable to meet with the Trustees on Thursday due to previously arranged commitments. During my conversation with John Padfield, he intimated that we were being unreasonable and uncooperative by not attending the meeting. This is just not the case. We were only given 5 days notice of the meeting, which John Padfield said was scheduled anyway and were only given the Trusts draft proposed changes 2 days before. To be told that we are being uncooperative by John Padfield was distressing and stressful. The gate owners have helped the Trust in many ways and have always been obliging, accommodating and tolerant.

We were promised by the Trustees that we would have a proper written response to the filming disturbances, which we are still waiting for. The gatehouses have received an official written apology from the Flyboys location manager but we have had nothing in writing from the Trust. We will contact John Padfield about a meeting once we have received your official correspondence.

It is with regret that I am forced to write to you again about disturbances caused by the activities at Copped Hall.

During your Open Day I was stuck in my car on my drive for over twenty minutes trying to exit through the main gates. Cars were double parked, blocking the gates and lined up all the way along the entrance driveway. I had to be at an appointment and was made late for this meeting, by an astonishing lack organisation by the Trust, which sadly was a repetitive theme for the day. Where were the supervisors that the Trust had assured us would attend all such events?

We attempted to walk to the Hall but were forced back by the extreme danger from vehicles speeding along the track. It was impossible to actually cross the bridge with a baby's buggy due to the volume of traffic. Cars were parked all along the track which made walking safely out of the question. We eventually decided that we had to leave our homes and we feel we were forced out to get away from the noise and dust. The East Lodge gatehouse residents did the same.

Yet again, no one from the Trust apologises to the residents, surly the most simplest of placating solutions, to the Open Day disruptions.

Dear Trustees and Committee members of The Copped Hall Trust

Thank you for your e-mail and apologising for the incredibly high number of Open Day visitors. The volume of traffic through the gates was quite shocking, as was the lack of management of the gates and driveway to Copped Hall. As previously stated, both lodge owners were forced to leave their homes due to the disruption of the Open Day event at Copped Hall.

The stewarding was ineffective and insufficient. One of the stewards deemed it acceptable to just sit in a chair under one of the willow trees, hardly moving or speaking to any of the car drivers as they passed him. So much so, that I had to control the incoming cars myself to enable my parents to leave in their car through the gates. The steward under the tree did not make any attempt to help or even acknowledge our presence. The driveway became over run with cars and had become extremely hazardous to walk along the driveway or to attempt to cross the very narrow motorway bridge. There is no pavement on the bridge and it is impossible to pass a car safely with a child's push-chair. Even walking along the grass verges is treacherous as there is no kerb for protection and all the vehicles pass precariously close. It would only take a moments lack of concentration for a serious accident to take place. Indeed, if there had been any accidents an emergency vehicle would not have been able to pass along the driveway or cross the bridge.

As you state in your e-mail, I find it incredible that the Corporation of London knowingly support the constant vehicular traffic along the precious historical track leading to Copped Hall and that they also condone the deterioration of the once safe path to the Copped Hall mansion. Especially as there is a perfectly suitable tar-macadam road that exists from the Bell Common entrance that has been used by the Copped Hall Trust for access on numerous occasions for years. It is not unreasonable to make this the main access route for all visitors to Copped Hall, as this will preserve the notable quality and nature of essentially a very important walking track for families in Epping and the surrounding areas.

All of the Copped Hall residents agree that they are also concerned that the volume of traffic persistently visiting Copped Hall has compromised the safety of the bridge, the driveway and even the entire character of Copped Hall Estate. The six apartments that use the driveway are not responsible for the problems that now exist when walking to Copped Hall, it is the Copped Hall Trust. I would like to suggest that all the Trustees and Committee members instead of driving to Copped Hall each time they choose to visit, that they should walk along the driveway to experience for themselves feeling threatened by any passing cars, vans or lorries. It is only since the Trusts increasing escalation of traffic to Copped Hall that these problems have begun and not only during organised events but on a regular daily basis. The driveway to Copped Hall used to be wonderfully tranquil and a very safe place for families and especially children to run and enjoy themselves but that unique sense of freedom has become totally compromised.

The proposals put forward to help improve the access to Copped Hall because of the increasingly high number of visitors and cars that you acknowledge use the driveway, needs careful consideration by us. Unfortunately, the disturbances and the state of affairs between the Gatehouse residents and The Trust, has led to my mother, owner of the East Lodge gatehouse being advised by her cardiologist to avoid becoming anxious or stressed. I therefore have had to take a lot more time to respond to you, as the difficulties with the Trust are the sole reason she has become unwell and she finds discussing the issues very distressing. I too have felt extremely harassed and stressed-out by the ongoing circumstances at Copped Hall. My family now very rarely enjoy walking to Copped Hall anymore, mainly from fearing for our safety and so many near-misses already from the traffic that now regularly goes to Copped Hall.

It is just such a shame that the escalation happened to Copped Hall at all and that the once exceptionally quiet and peaceful driveway and mansion, is no more.

As we continue to prepare and take advice on our response to the Trust, disturbances still continue to occur. We are still collecting all the relevant information that we feel may be required to resolve the continuing problems. I hope that we will be in a position to deal with your proposals very soon.

I would like to respond to your e-mail regarding the traffic problems caused by the open day at Copped Hall. As Head Forest Keeper I had no idea of the scale of the event or the problems that occurred until after the event had taken place. As you must know the Trust has a right of access to the Hall and as I understand does not have access rights on the "tarmac" road from the Bell Common entrance.

I did contact the Trust as soon as possible after the event to express my concerns and that before any future events we would need to look at the problems that may occur. I have now put in place with the Trust strict controls to prevent parking on any Forest or Buffer lands along the drive during any event taking place at the Hall. I have also insisted that the level and quality of stewarding is increased. I am aware that an event is taking place on Sunday 18th Sept and my Forest Keepers will be patrolling in the area and noting any problems that occur.

I am not the right person to comment on all the other problems you have pointed out in your e-mail, they need to be directed to either our land agent J. Holtom or to the Superintendent J. Wisenfeld.

12:15 - 1240 There have been people banging on our front door and shouting at us, the Gate owners, to allow them access through the gates. This caused a worrying amount of stress for my mother and father who were the first to be disturbed by the people trying to gain access to the Copped Hall event. There was no one from the Copped Hall Trust present on the Gates to make sure this sort of problem didn't occur, again!!. My wife had to call Alan Cox on his mobile phone to get someone to attend.

The disturbance from the cars has been continuous today. My wife, my elderly parents and I are vexed, stressed and upset. The stress caused to us by the Trusts activities is ongoing and must be totally unacceptable.

This e-mail is to inform you that the gatehouse owners are still being disturbed at 22:30 by large lorries, vans and cars exiting the estate. Thank you for our telephone conversation. It is a relief to know that The Corporation of London are concerned about the increasing disturbance to the drive to Copped Hall and the change of use that has occurred to the Hall. The following dates are only the 'published' dates of Trust events at Copped Hall. There are on average three events every month. If you factor in the 'set-up' and 'break-down' days before and after each event, the 'preparation' discussions that take place at the Hall, the regular Committee meetings and the constant flow of volunteers then the volume of vehicular traffic is unreasonable and has had a detrimental effect to the driveway to Copped Hall. As we discussed, the unique character of Copped Hall was very special. It must therefore be paramount that the erosion to the environment of Copped Hall is halted immediately and returned back to the public as a safe place to walk again.

Application for a full licence by Copped Hall Trust

As residents directly adjacent to the Hall we would like to oppose the above application for the following reasons:

- We do not want to hinder the fund raising events and good work that the 1) Copped Hall Trust to renovate the mansion and it's grounds, but feel that the present arrangement of special licences is sufficient for their purpose.
- 2) We feel that we would be greatly disturbed by any extra functions that this would enable the Trust to hold at the mansion or in it's grounds.
- 3) The road into the estate is used by the residents and all visitors to the Mansion. This road is an unmade road and the condition of the surface struggles to cope with the amount of traffic at the present moment. This is not only the fact that most of it is single lane only and can cause serious delays if there is a large amount of traffic.
- 4) The Trust is a charity and not a business, therefore we cannot understand the need for a full licence
- 5) There are still constant problems with vandals and people trying to enter the hall and the grounds during the times when only the residents are here to deal with the security and safety of the mansion and surrounds. If it is known that the Trust has a full licence and there may be alcohol stored on site, this may lead to more aggravation.

Finally we feel that there has to be consideration and respect for the residents in all J.K. LEVER matters concerning the running of entertainment events, and that is the main reason that we strongly oppose this application.
